GRAVITY

Gravity is a fundamental interaction which causes mutual attraction between all things with mass or energy. From collapsing hydrogen clouds into stars to galaxies together, gravity is present everywhere.



Gravity helps us to be on the ground and walk. Without gravity, the whole



world will be mismanaged and all the organisms (including plants, animals, insects, human beings etc.) will be in the air. The concept of gravity was brought by a great British mathematician and physicist, Sir Isaac Newton. When one day, sitting under a tree, an apple

falls on him. Then he noticed that (Why do all things fall on the earth?). He then thought that a force on earth pulls everything towards it. So, he introduced the concept of gravity to the world and made three laws of force of gravity or gravitational force. They were: -



1. Everybody continues in a state of rest or uniform motion (constant velocity) in a straight line unless acted on by a force.
2. When the force acting upon an object is increased, the acceleration of the object is increased.
3. When the opposite object exerts a force on another object, the object exerts an equal and opposite force on that object.

Gravity has many impacts. It has some advantages and disadvantages. It is useful in practice for astronauts like these astronauts who do 0 gravity exercise.

NATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY



Mathematics is a very interesting subject. From its rich history to different tricks and tips, mathematics lays down a number of amazing facts to help students get involved with this subject in a better way.

Some interesting mathematical facts: -

- ❖ The word "hundred" comes from the old Norse term, "hundrath", which actually means 120 and not 100.
- ❖ There is only one number in the entire Hindu Arabic number system which can be spelled with the same number of letters as itself. That number is four.
- ❖ Seven is the most significant number across religions and cultures. For example, seven colours in a rainbow, seven days in a week, seven notes on the musical skill, etc.
- ❖ The signs Plus (+) and Minus (-) were discovered as early as in 1489 A.D.
- ❖ In the Indian number system, from 0 to 1000, letter A only appears first in 1000 ("one thousand").
- ❖ If you multiply 6 by an even number, the answer will end with the same digit. Example: $6 \times 4 = 24$.
- ❖ If you multiply any number by 9 and then add the digits sum of digits will be always 9
- ❖ To multiply any two-digit number by 11, simply add the digits of the number together and then put this sum between the original two digits. Example: $11 \times 53 = 583$ ($5+3=8$)

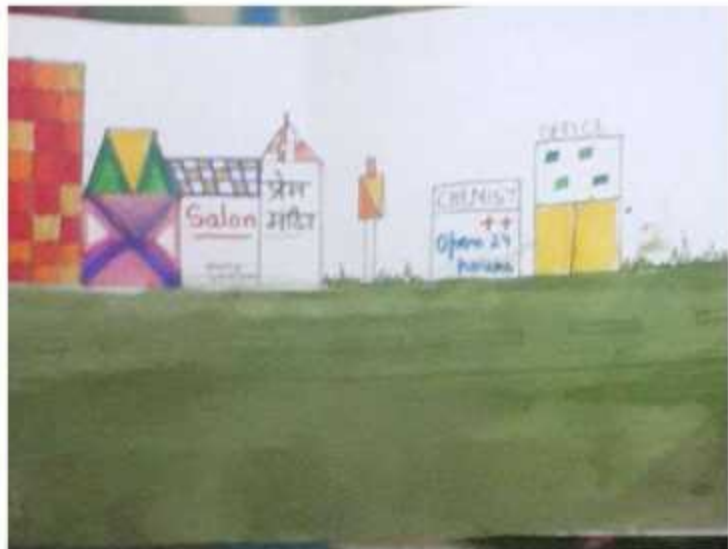
