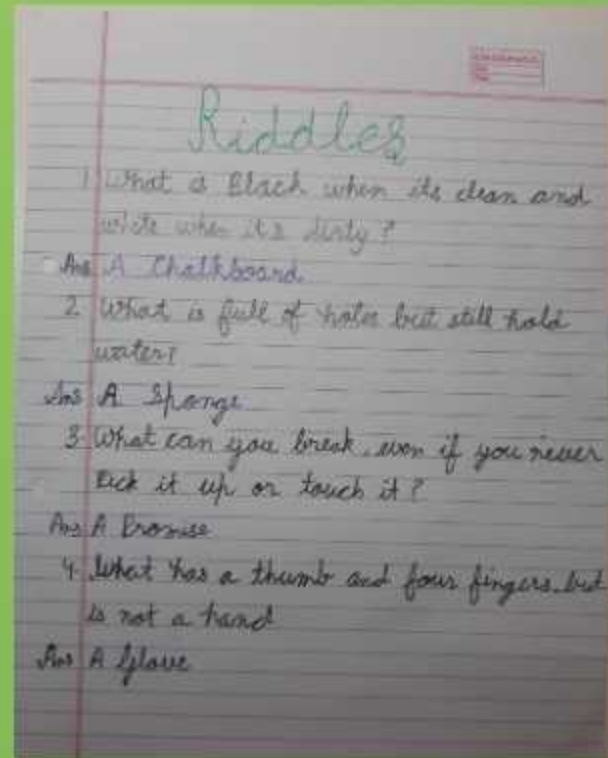

SHRI GURU TEGH BAHADUR JI - 'PROTECTOR OF HUMANITY'



Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji was the sixth Guru of Sikhs, often venerated as the 'Protector of Humanity' (Bhūta-ki-Chakar) by the Sikhs. Known as a great teacher, he was an excellent warrior, thinker and poet, who wrote detailed description of the nature of the God, mind, body and physical attractiveness. His writings are housed in the sacred text 'Guru Granth Sahib' in the form of 115 poetic hymns.



EARLY LIFE

Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji was born as Tegh Mal on 3rd April, 1621 at Amritsar. His parents were Guru Hargobind Ji and Bibi Ranki Ji. He was named Tegh Bahadur keeping his courage and bravery after participating in the war against Mughals. He was trained in several skills such as archery and horsemanship. In 1632, he got married to Mata Gupi. They were blessed with a son named Guru Gobind Singh Ji. By now Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji had begun to spend much of his time in meditation. He was an avid traveler and played a key role in setting up preaching centers throughout the Indian subcontinent.



ONE OF THE PROMINENT TEACHINGS OF GURU TEGH BAHADUR JI WAS THAT ONE SHOULD BE WILLING TO FOLLOW A FAITH, RATHER THAN BE COERCED INTO IT.

TEACHINGS AND WORK

The Sikh gurus wrote several hymns to Guru Granth Sahib. His works include 136 shabads, 15 ragas and 782 compositions which were also added to the holy Sikh book: Guru Granth Sahib. He showed the path of divinity to his disciples by teaching them to overcome greed, desire, ego and pain. He taught the world to be content with their life. His teachings also include protecting the ones who need protection even if it comes at the cost of one's own life. He precept on the omnipresence of the Almighty and the belief that the Lord lives within us and one only needs to connect with Him.

GURU TEGH BAHADUR'S MARTYRDOM

The religious leader was beheaded by the Mughal emperor Aurangzeb in Delhi as he fought against forced conversion and other religious oppressions. Gurdwaras Sri Guru Sahib Ji and Durdwara Hazrat Nang Sahib Ji in the national capital are considered to be where he was executed and cremated. His sacrifice and death anniversary is paid tribute with Sahasri Dusak of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji every year on November 24.

LABOUR DAY CELEBRATION



May 1 is celebrated as Labour day also known as May Day. It is also known as Kamgar Din or Antarrashtriya Shramik Diwas, Kamgar Divas, Mazdoor Diwas.

Why is Labour Day celebrated?
During industrialization at the beginning of the 19th Century, the labour class was exploited in United States of America by industrialists and were made to work up to 15 hours a day. This forced the workers to raise their voice against the exploitation and they demanded paid leaves, proper wages and breaks for the workforce. By the late 19th century, a legal working time of eight-hours was declared in Chicago's national convention by the American Federation of Labour. Following this pronouncement, many countries including India adopted the eight-hour working policy.

Labour day is also observed as International Workers' Day
In India, the first labour day was celebrated in 1923 by the Labour Kisan Party of Hindustan. Indian has a separate 'Ministry of Labour' which works on the welfare of the working class.
