





ARTICLE ON SHRI GURU DEV RABINDRANATH TAGORE JAYANTI

ABOUT NOBEL PRIZE WINNER, FAMOUS INDIAN WRITER SHRI GURU DEV RABINDRANATH TAGORE, HIS REAL NAME IS "RABINDRANATH THAKUR". HIS NICKNAME WAS "RABI". HIS BIRTHDAY, ALSO KNOWN AS "RABINDRANATH TAGORE JAYANTI" IS CELEBRATED ON THE 25TH DAY OF THE BENGALI MONTH BOISHAKH OR MAY 7TH EACH YEAR. HIS BIRTHPLACE IS JORASANKO, CALCUTTA (PRESENT-DAY KOLKATA). HIS PARENTS ARE DEBENDRANATH TAGORE AND SHARDA DEVI.BEING THE ICONIC FIGURE IN THE EDUCATIONAL HISTORY OF INDIA, RABINDRANATH TAGORE WAS NOT SATISFIED WITH THE EDUCATION SYSTEM PREVALENT AT THAT TIME IN THE COUNTRY, WHICH MADE HIM ISOLATE HIMSELF FROM IT. DESPITE BEING BORN INTO AN EDUCATED FAMILY, TAGORE DID NOT ATTEND SCHOOL AND RATHER RECEIVED HISEDUCATION AT HOME FROM HIS BROTHER HEMENDRANATH, HE IS WIDELY REGARDED AS THE GREATEST MODERN INDIAN POET. HIS ACHIEVEMENTS ARE -HE WAS REWARDED WITH THE NOBEL PRIZE IN LITERATURE IN THE YEAR 1913, RABINDRANATH TAGORE WAS THE FIRST ASIAN TO WIN A NOBEL PRIZE, HE INTRODUCED THE SHORT STORY GENRE TO BENGALI LITERATURE, AND HE WAS A LEADING PLAYWRIGHT OF HIS ERA.HIS PROMINENT BOOKS ARE - GITANJALI, THE HOME AND THE WORLD, SHESHAR KOBITA, LIPIKA, STRAY BIRDS, I WON'T LET YOU GO, THE LOVER OF GOD, OF MYSELF, AND RED OLEANDERS. HE HAS WRITTEN NATIONAL ANTHEMFOROF INDIA AND BANGLADESH. SHRI GURU DEV RABINDRANATH TAGORE DIED ON 7 AUGUST, 1941. HE WAS SUFFERING FROM THE DISEASE PROSTATE CANCER.





INTERESTING ARTICLE

In 2013, a team of psychologists at Harvard University published a paper in which they outlined "the end of history illusion."

In the study, the team asked half of the thousands of study participants to predict how much their values would change in the next 10 years, and the other half to tell them how much their values had changed in the previous 10 years.

Here's Dan Gilbert, one of the psychologists who participated in the study, and the author of the 2006 bestseller *Stumbling on Happiness*, explaining the results:


At every age, from 18 to 68 in our data set, people vastly underestimated how much change they would experience over the next 10 years. We call this the end of history illusion. To give you an idea of the magnitude of this effect [...] 18-year-olds anticipate changing only as much as 50-year-olds actually do.

Gilbert continues:

Human beings are works in progress that mistakenly think they're finished. The person you are right now is as transient, as fleeting, and as temporary as all the people you've ever been. The one constant in our life is change.

Adaptation of the first of J.K. Rowling's popular children's novels about Harry Potter, a boy who learns on his eleventh birthday that he is the orphaned son of two powerful wizards and possesses unique magical powers of his own. He is summoned from his life as an unwanted child to become a student at Hogwarts, an English boarding school for wizards. There, he meets several friends who become his closest allies and help him discover the truth about his parents' mysterious deaths.

Author : RUSKIN BOND



A Brief Synopsis: A young boy Rakesh Plants a cherry seedling in his garden and watches it grow. As seasons go by, the small tree survives heavy monsoon showers, a hungry goat eats most of the leaves and a grass cutter who splits it into two with one sweep. At last, on his ninth birthday, Rakesh is rewarded with a miraculous sight—the first pink blossoms of his precious cherry tree.

Recommendations: A book with a lovely, gentle rhythm encouraging patience and a love for nature as the cherry tree grows. Transforming a simple plot into a story that captures one's imagination and tugs at one's heart's core is a gift which only Ruskin Bond can give us. Illustrations are well done, the story line is simple but realistic, and the story itself is one that many children can relate to. Highly recommended one.



International labour day







ARTICLE ON BAISAKHI


