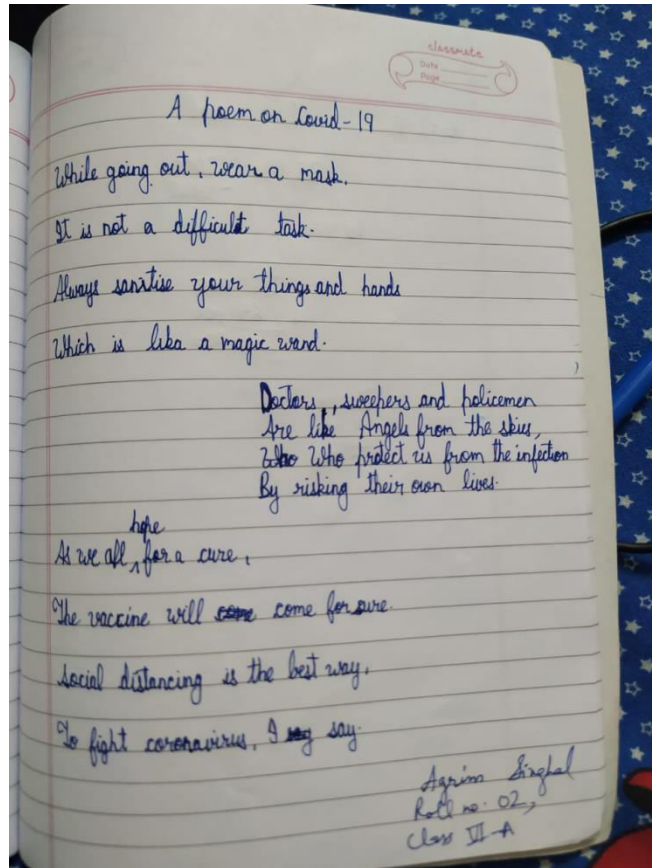

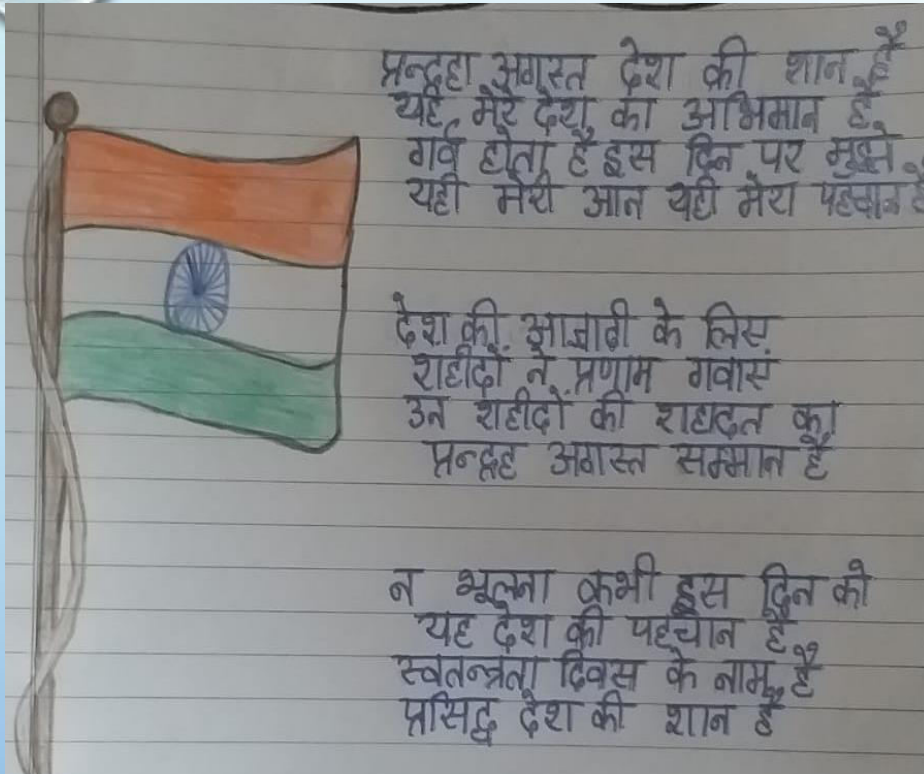

Parades and pageants showcase scenes from the independence struggle and India's diverse cultural traditions.

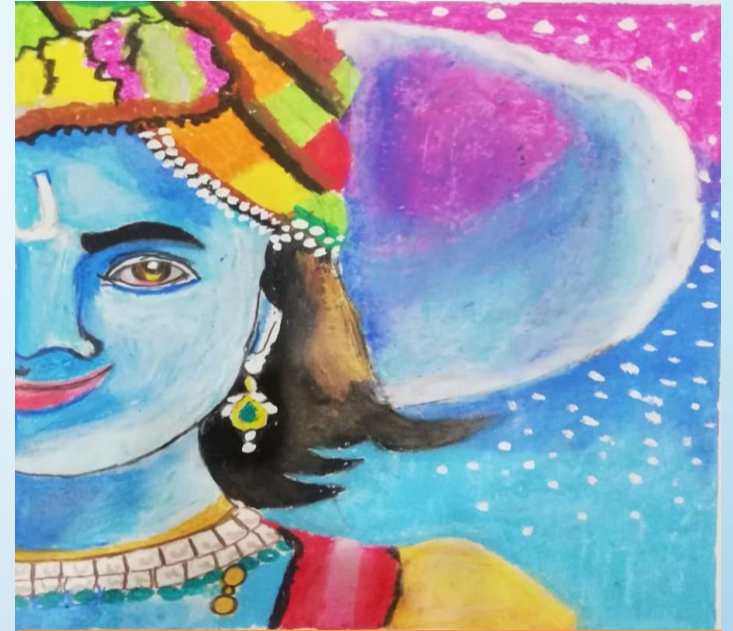
# KRISHNA JANMASHTI

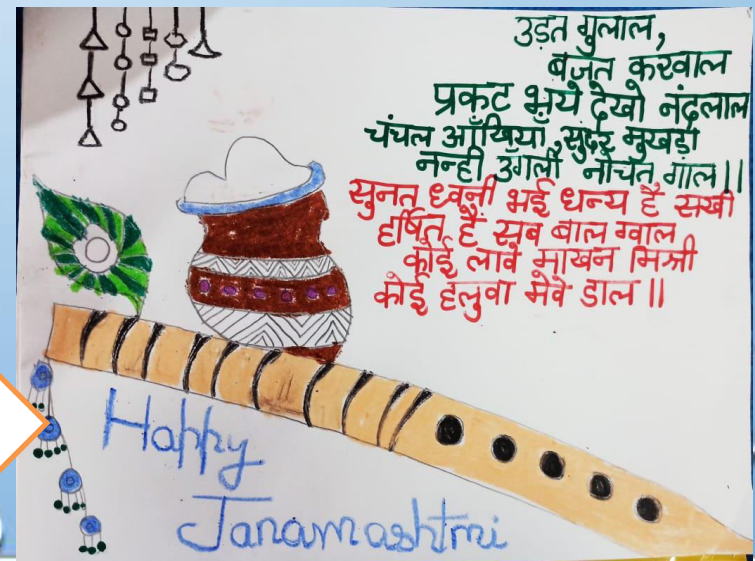
Where: Mumbai, Maharashtra

What's Special: The Dahi Handi where the clay pot is filled with curd is hung over with a thread. Young boys make a human pyramid and hit the pot with a stick.

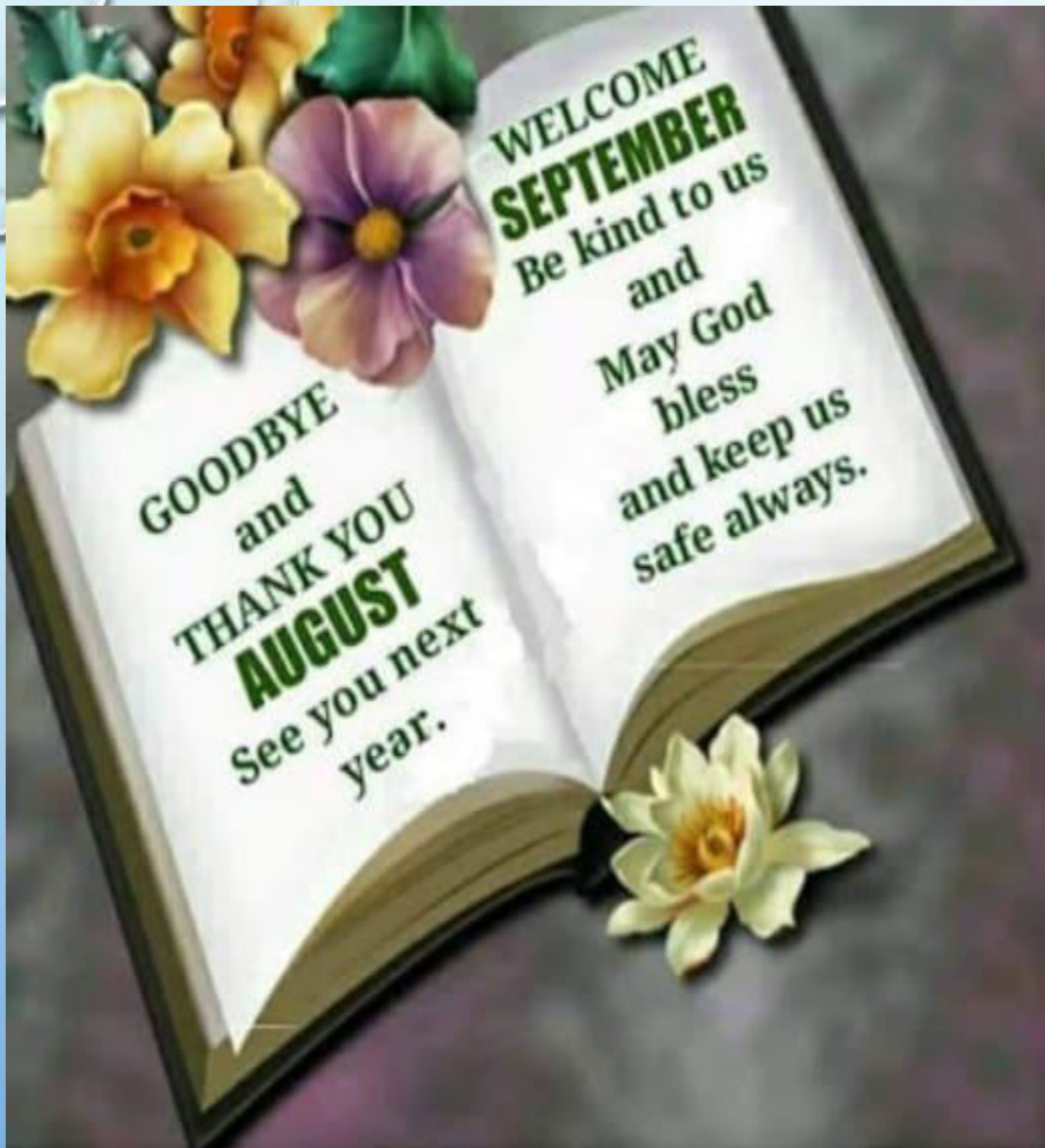

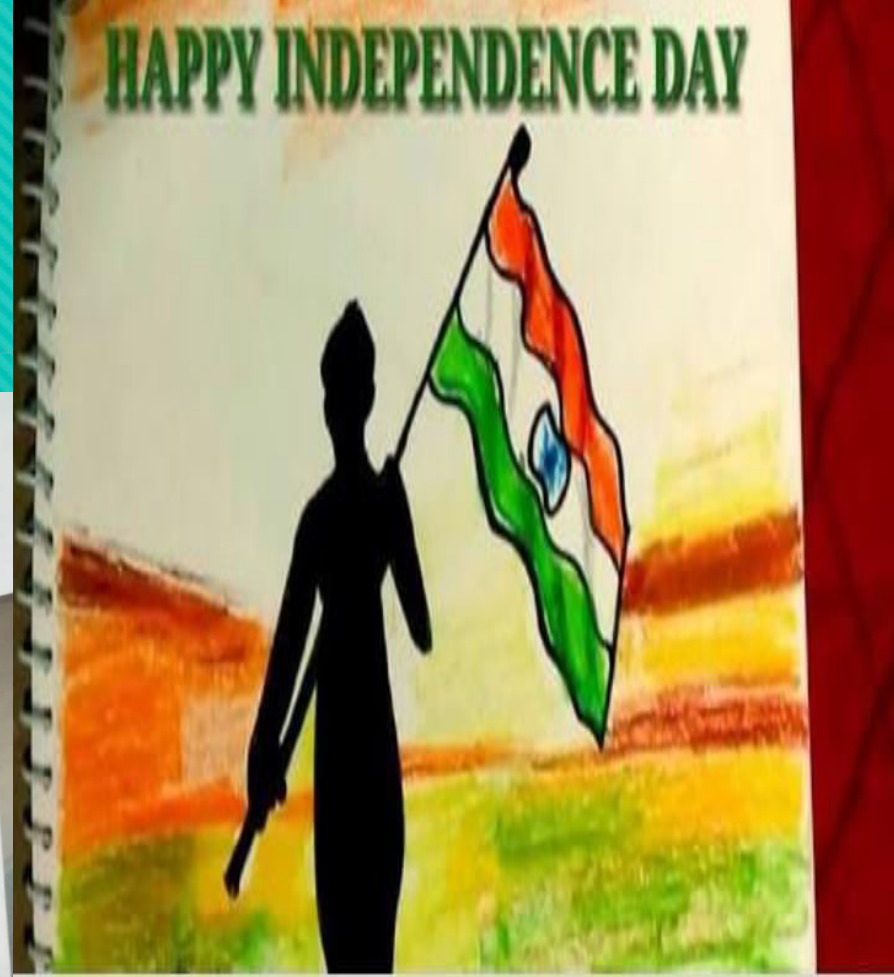
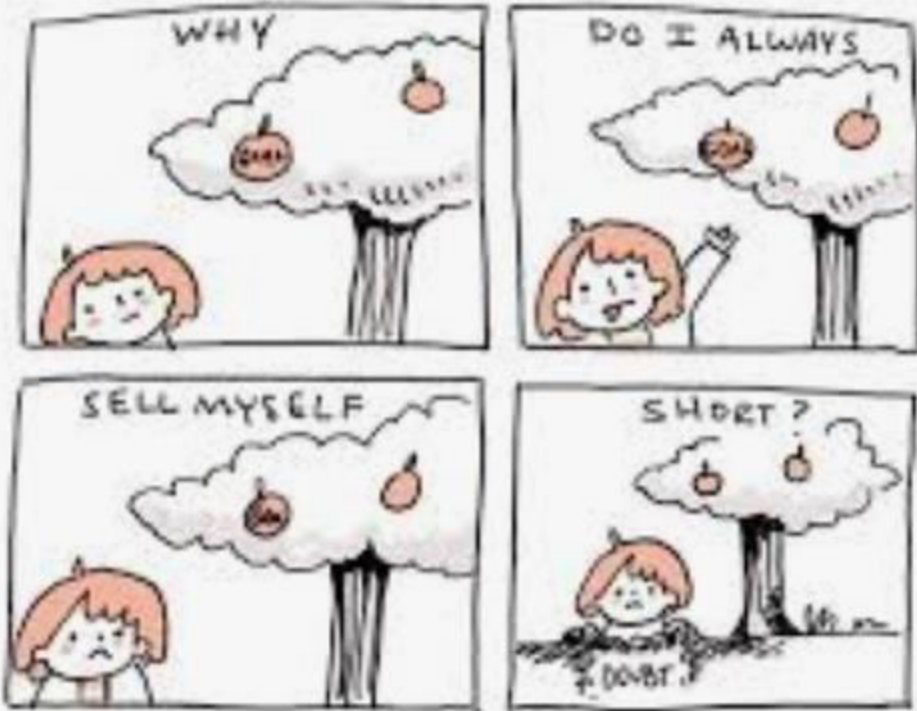

# Black hole

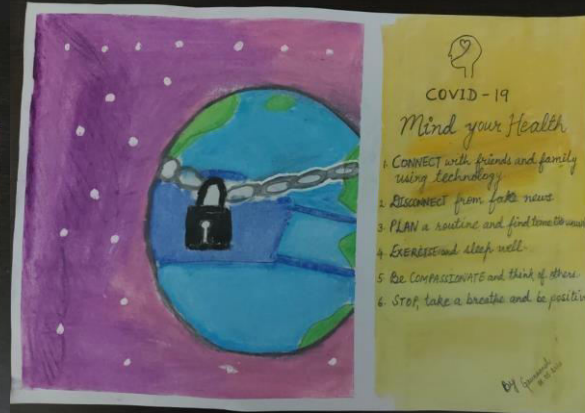
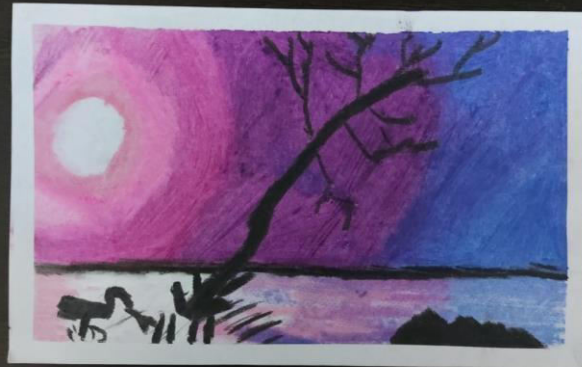
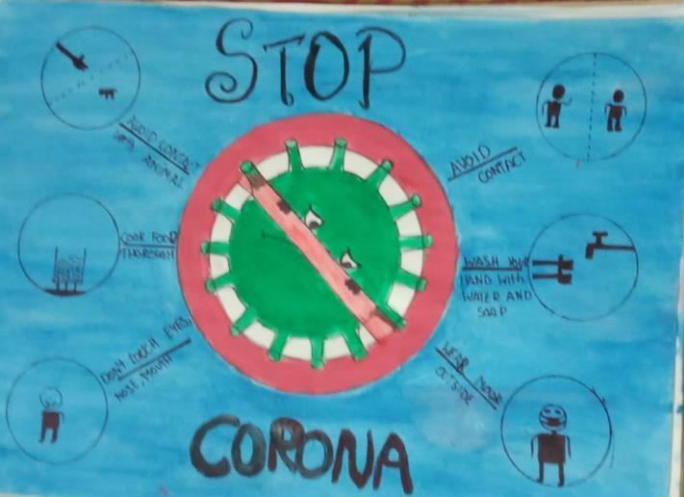
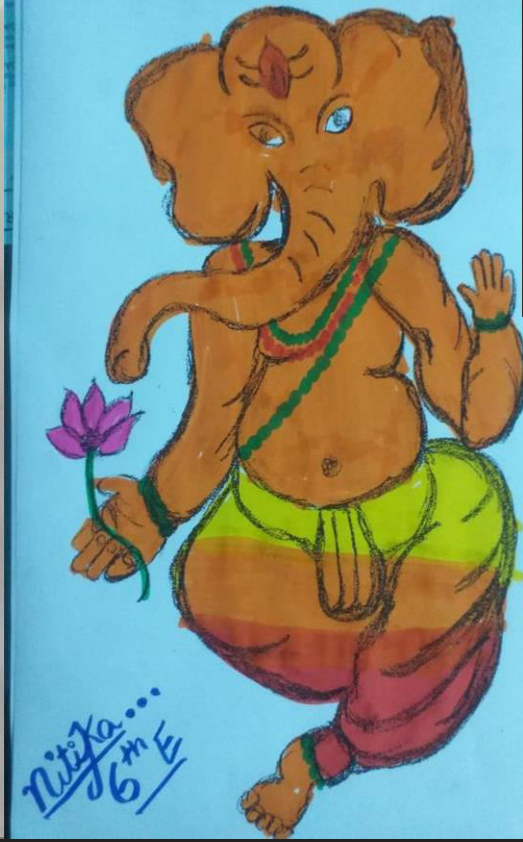


□ A black hole is a region of spacetime where gravity is so strong that nothing—no particles or even electromagnetic radiation such as light—can escape from it! The theory of general relativity predicts that a sufficiently compact mass can deform spacetime to form a black hole.<sup>[7][8]</sup> The boundary of the region from which no escape is possible is called the event horizon. Although the event horizon has an enormous effect on the fate and circumstances of an object crossing it, according to general relativity it has no locally detectable features.

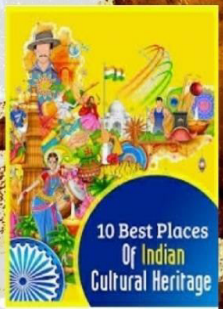

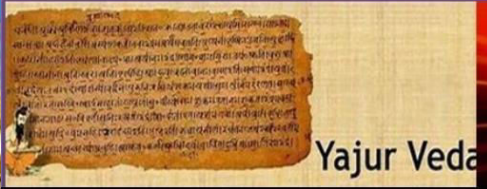

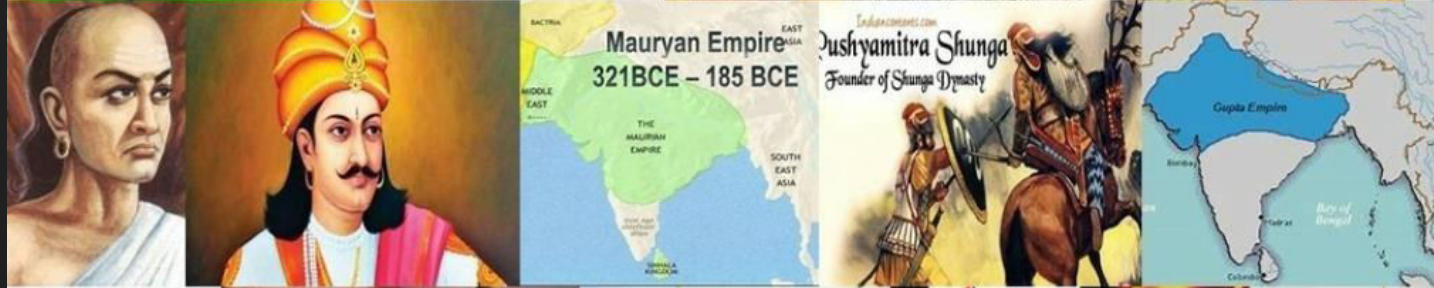


ADAM,S BRIDGE [RAMSETU]  
 Adam's Bridge, also known as Rama's Bridge or Rama Setu, is a chain of limestone shoals, between Pamban Island, also known as Rameswaram Island, off the south-eastern coast of Tamil Nadu, India, and Mannar Island, off the north-western coast of Sri Lanka. Geological evidence suggests that this bridge is a former land connection between India and Sri Lanka.  
 NASA satellite photo: India on top, Sri Lanka at the bottom. The bridge is 48 km (30 mi) long and separates the Gulf of Mannar (south-west) from the Palk Strait (northeast). Some of the regions are dry and the sea in the area rarely exceeds 1 metre (3 ft) in depth, thus hindering navigation. It was reportedly passable on foot until the 15th century, when storms deepened the channel; temple records seem to say that Adam's Bridge was completely above sea level until it broke in a cyclone in 1480.
