- 2) The Jayanti is celebrated to mark the birth of tenth and last master Guru Gobind Singh.
- 3) He was a spiritual master as well as a warrior and the last guru of Sikhs.
- 4) He was born on 5<sup>th</sup> January 1666 in Patna, Bihar in a Khatri family.
- 5) He founded the Sikh warrior community in 1699 known as 'Khalsa'.
- 6) Guru Gobind Singh Jayanti is observed for three days on the holy shrine in Patna Sahib.
- 7) The holy text of the Sikhs, Guru Granth Sahib is displayed on a 'palki' in a procession on the day.

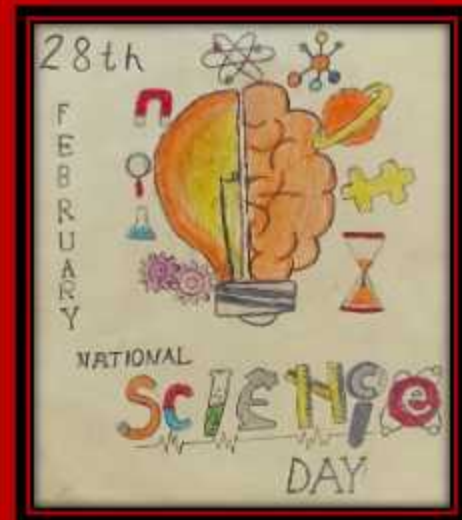

In 1986, the National Council for Science and Technology Communication (NCSTC) asked the Government of India to designate February 28 as National Science Day. The event is now celebrated all over India in schools, colleges, universities and other academic, scientific, technical, medical and research institutions. On the occasion of the first National Science Day (28 February 1987) NCSTC announced the institution of the National Science popularization awards for recognizing outstanding efforts in the area of science and communication. National Science Day is celebrated in India every year on 28 February. The celebration also includes public speeches, radio, TV, science movies, science exhibitions based on themes and concepts, debates, quiz competitions, lectures, science model exhibitions and many more activities. It is celebrated to discuss all the issues and implement new technologies for the development in the field of science, to give an opportunity to the scientific minded citizens in India, to encourage the people as well as popularize science and technology.

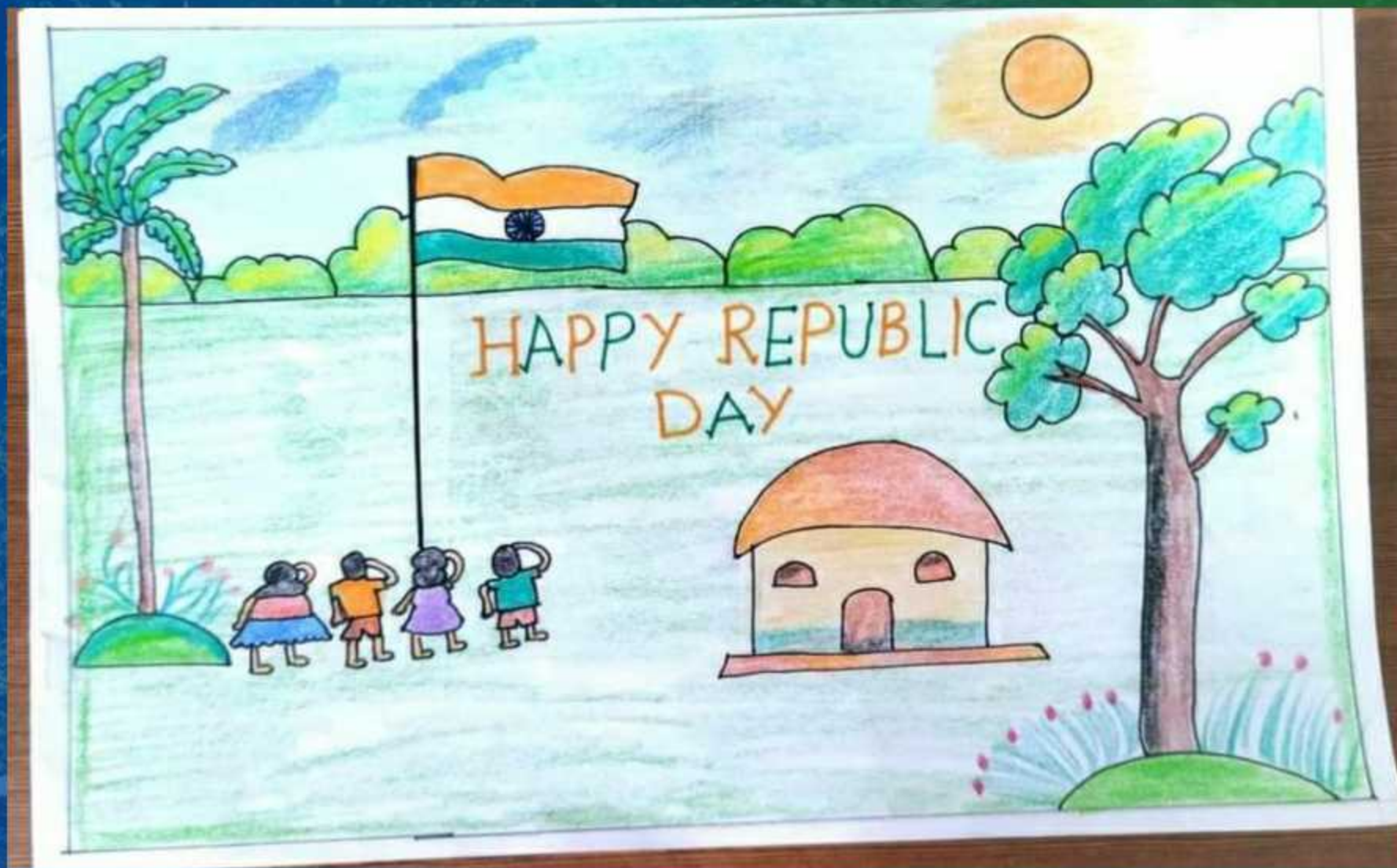

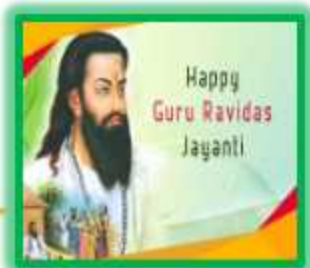

- Lohri is the festival that is mainly related to harvesting of the Rabi (sugarcane) crops.
- It is celebrated on January 13 each year.
- Lohri is mostly celebrated around a bonfire.
- Women and people dance and make merry.
- It is commonly celebrated at the end of peak winter.
- The other important food-related to Lohri is Radishes.
- Gur-Rewari, Peanuts, and popcorns are eaten with joy around the bonfire.
- The traditional food is the Gajjak, Sarson da saag, and makes di Roti.
- They also eat Til-Rice (sesame rice) made with jaggery.
- Lohri is believed to be a symbol of new beginnings.
