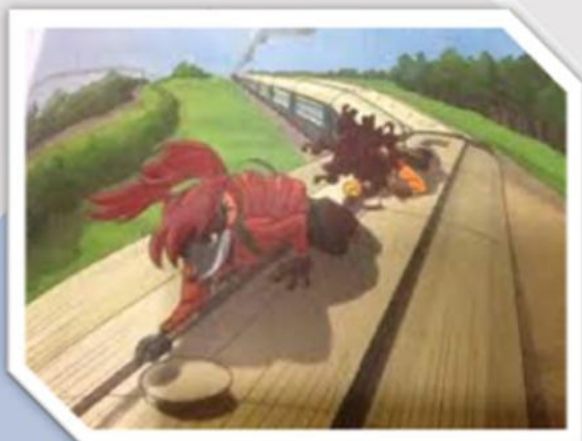

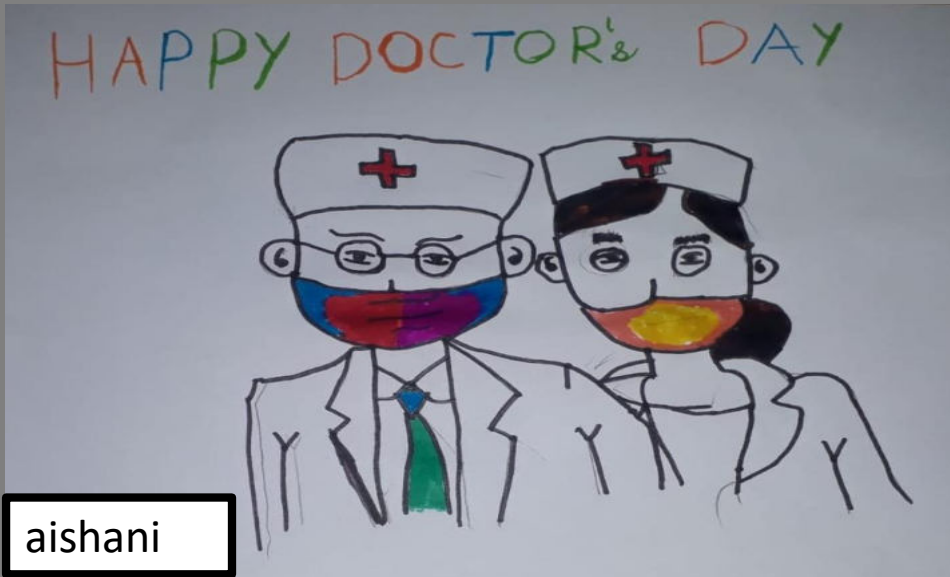
People in Tamil Nadu draw beautiful patterns called Kolam, made with rice batter on the entrances of their houses and tiny footprints of little Krishna entering their houses.

Independence Day

Independence Day is celebrated on 15th of August as a national holiday of India. This day marks the day when India got freedom from the Britishers. The Britishers ruled on the Indian subcontinent from 1858 to 1947. The rule is also called Crown rule in India, or direct rule in India. Independence Day is one of the three national holidays observed in India.

On the day of Independence Day, the President of India delivers the "Address to the Nation". On 15 August, the Prime Minister hoists the Indian flag on the ramparts of the historical site of Red Fort in Delhi. Twenty-one gun shots are fired in honour of the solemn occasion. The schools, Government and some non-government offices hoist flag in their buildings. Some schools decorate their classrooms with premises with paper, balloon decorations with hangings of freedom fighter portraits on their walls and major government buildings are often adorned with strings of lights. Terrorist Groups have issued threats and have carried out attacks around Independence Day, in the anticipation of terrorist attacks, particularly from militants, security measures are intensified, especially in major cities such as Delhi and Mumbai and in troubled states such as Jammu and Kashmir. On the Independence Day patriotic movies, songs are broadcasted all over the country. In schools children tend to wear tricolored dresses (red, white, green) to celebrate the occasion.

Raksha Bandhan

It is celebrated as a secular, non denominational and multicultural Hindu festival in different parts of India.

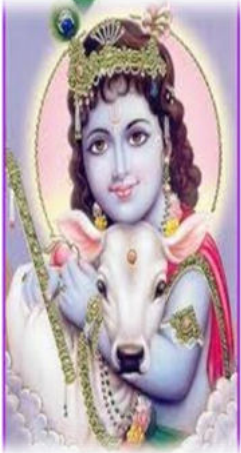

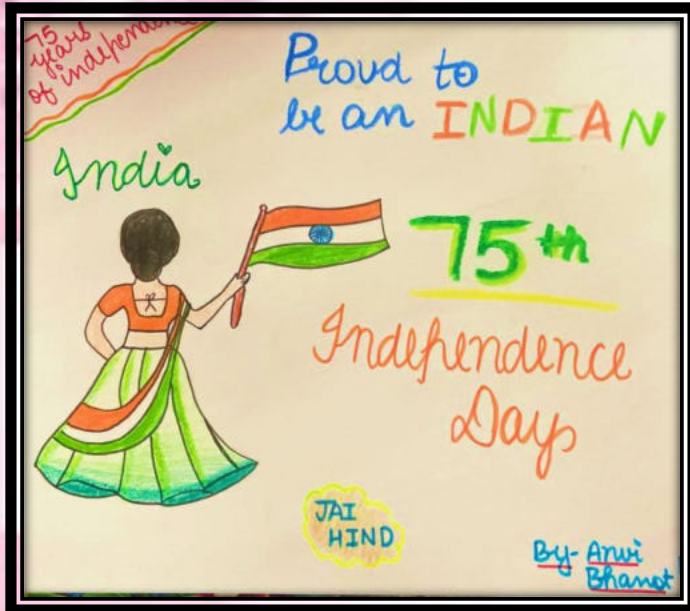

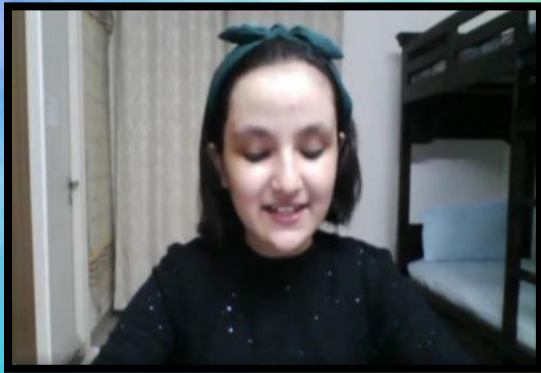

DREE FESTIVAL!

The festival, which is celebrated in the United States, is a celebration of the independence of the United States. It is a day when the people of the United States celebrate their freedom and the freedom of the world. The festival is celebrated on the 4th of July, which is the day when the United States declared its independence from Great Britain. The festival is celebrated with fireworks, parades, and other activities. It is a day of joy and celebration for the people of the United States and for the people of the world.

4th Of July!

The fourth of July is celebrated as the Independence Day of USA. It is a federal holiday commemorating the independence of USA on July 4, 1776. The Congress had voted to declare independence two days earlier, on July 2, but it was not declared until July 4. Independence is commonly associated with fireworks, parades, barbecues, carnivals, fairs, picnics, concerts, baseball games, family reunions, political speeches, and demonstrations. In addition to various other activities and programs aimed at honoring the history, governments, and traditions of the United States, Independence Day is the national day of the United States. Americans often celebrate Independence Day by having or attending a picnic or barbecue; many take advantage of the day off work, or some areas, being expected to gather with relatives or friends. Demonstrations (e.g., marches, rallies, and protests) are generally colorful and artistic, and that the colors of the American flag. Parades are often held in the morning, before family get-togethers, while fireworks displays occur in the evening after dark at such places as parks, fairgrounds, or town squares. Independence Day fireworks are often accompanied by patriotic songs such as "The Star-Spangled Banner" (the American national anthem). A salute of one gun for each state in the United States, called a "salute to the union", is held on Independence Day at noon by many coastal military bases. New York City has the largest fireworks display in the country sponsored by Macy's, with more than 22 hours of pyrotechnics scheduled in 2008. It generally holds displays in the East River. Other major displays are in Seattle on Lake Union, in San Diego near Mission Bay, in Boston on the Charles River, in Philadelphia near the Independence Mall, in San Francisco near the San Francisco Bay, and on the National Mall in Washington, D.C. During the annual White House-Capitol International Freedom Festival, Dennis, Michigan hosts one of the largest fireworks displays in North America, near the Detroit River, to celebrate Independence Day in conjunction with Windsor, Ontario's celebration of Canada Day. The first weeks of July is typically one of the busiest United States travel periods of the year, as many citizens use what is often a three-day holiday weekend for extended vacation time. Until 1908, the original fourth of July parade in Bristol, Rhode Island, is the oldest continuous Independence Day celebration in the United States.

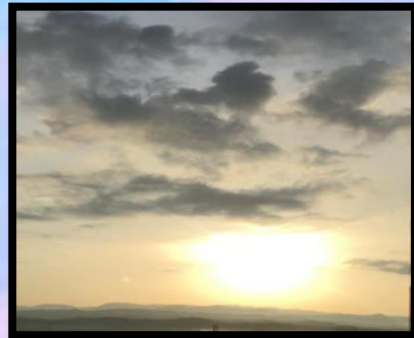

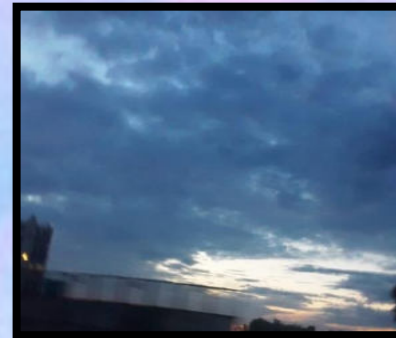

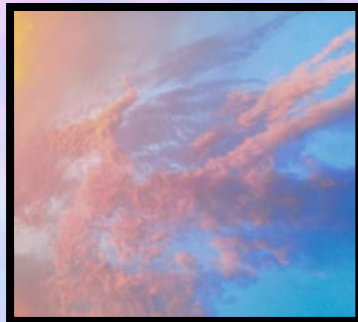

DIARY OF A YOUNG GIRL (AUTOBIOGRAPHY) ARNAV SHARMA

This book "The Diary Of A Young Girl" is the real diary of a teenage girl that begins on Anne's 13th birthday (12 June 1942) when she gets a diary. They escape to Amsterdam where they go into hiding with other Jews. The diary ends suddenly on 1 August 1944.

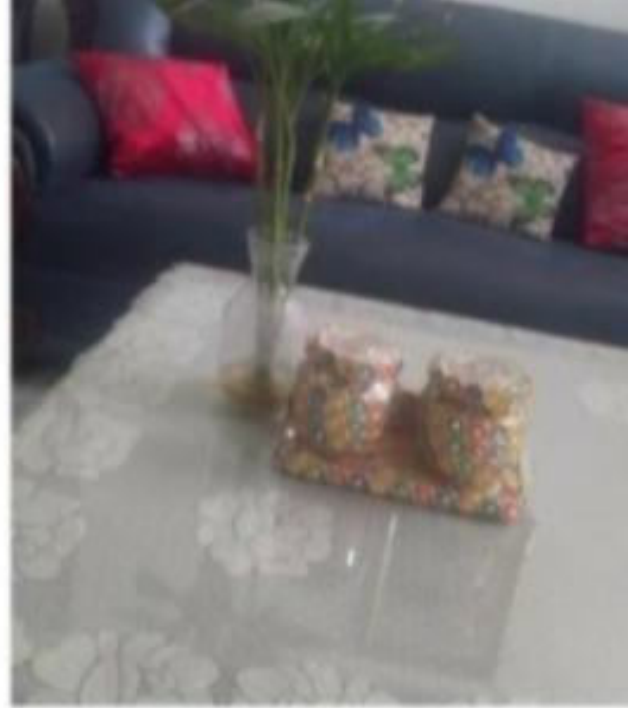
