END THE SILENCE. END THE IMPUNITY. END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN! DID YOU KNOW THAT AT LEAST ONE IN THREE WOMEN WILL EXPERIENCE SOME FORM OF VIOLENCE DURING THEIR LIFETIME.

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN IS NOW WELL RECOGNISED AS A PUBLIC HEALTH PROBLEM AND HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATION OF WORLDWIDE SIGNIFICANCE. IT IS AN IMPORTANT RISK FACTOR FOR WOMEN'S ILL HEALTH, WITH FAR REACHING CONSEQUENCES FOR BOTH THEIR PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH. IT IS ROOTED IN THE GENDER INEQUALITY THAT WOMEN FACE THROUGHOUT THEIR LIVES FROM CHILDHOOD THROUGH TO OLD AGE.

I BELIEVE THAT IT IS ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT BARRIERS TO OUR MISSION TO END POVERTY. POVERTY EXPOSES THEM TO FURTHER VIOLENCE AND A LACK OF OPTIONS WHEN VIOLENCE OCCURS. VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN CAN TAKE A NUMBER OF FORMS AND ARISE.



IN A NUMBER OF SITUATION. THEY ARE MOST OFTEN THE VICTIMS OF RAPE WHICH IS USUALLY PERPETRATED BY MEN KNOWN TO THEM, IN SOME COUNTRIES RAPE IS NOT EVEN REPORTED OR PROPERLY RECORDED BY POLICE BECAUSE OF CONSEQUENCES ON THE VICTIM.

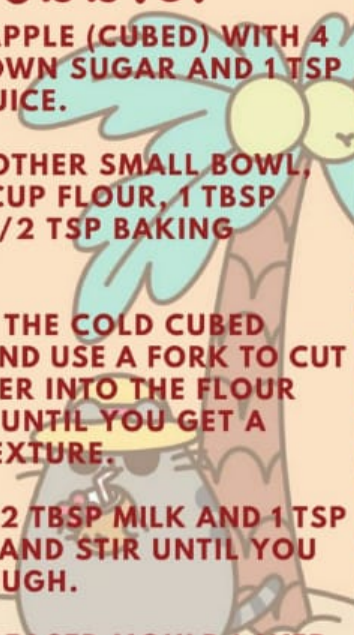

## Apple cobbler

1. MIX 1 APPLE (CUBED) WITH 4 TBSP BROWN SUGAR AND 1 TSP LEMON JUICE.
2. IN ANOTHER SMALL BOWL, MIX 1/4 CUP FLOUR, 1 TBSP SUGAR, 1/2 TSP BAKING POWDER

# *It's Celebration Time!*

November is the month for festivals. Here are some festivals of November celebrated across the country with much enthusiasm.

**1. Bhai Dooj – Celebrating the brother-sister bond**

**Where: Throughout India**

Bhai Dooj is one of the oldest festivals in India, and is celebrated in different parts of the country with different names. It is known as Bhau Beej in Goa, Maharashtra and Karnataka, Bhai Phota in Bengal, and Ningol Chakuba in Manipur.

**2. Chhath Puja – Prayers to the sun God**

**Where: Eastern UP, Bihar, Jharkhand, and West Bengal**

Dedicated to the Sun God, Chhath Puja is celebrated on the 6th day after Diwali. It is a 4-day long affair that comprises of a holy dip in the Ganges, offering prayers before sunrise, and preparation of prasad – sweet thekua, liiti, and chokha.

**3. Karva chauth – celebrating the bond of love**

**Where: Delhi, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh.**

It is a celebration of love, marriage and the unbreakable bond shared between a husband and wife. The word “Karva” means an earthen pot of water and the word chauth means fourth. It signifies that Karva Chauth falls on the fourth day after poornima (full moon), in the month of Kartik, according to the Hindu calendar.

**4. Diwali – Festival of lights!**

**Where- entire India**

**In most of the regions, Lord Ganesha, who is the god of wisdom and auspiciousness is worshiped on the day of Diwali. Diwali marks the anniversary of Nirvana or liberation of Mahavira's soul in Jainism. In West Bengal, Diwali is celebrated to worship goddess Kali, who is the goddess of Shakti.**

**5. Govardhan Puja – festival dedicated to lord Krishna**

**Where: Haryana, Punjab, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh.**

**Govardhan Puja is performed by devotees of Lord Krishna. On the day of Govardhan Puja, people cook and offer around 56 dishes, called chhappan bhog, to Lord Krishna as a mark of gratitude. People also worship cows on this day and devotees recreate Govardhan Parvat using cow dung.**

**6. Guru Tegh Bahadur's Martyrdom Day – Shaheed Diwas**

**Where: Punjab**

**On 24 November 1675, Guru Tegh Bahadur sacrificed his life to protect Kashmiri pandit from forceful religious conversion by the cruel Mughal Emperors. This day is commemorated by retelling of this brave tale and langar at the Gurudwara.**



**7. Guru Nanak Jayanti — Guruparb**

**Where: Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and parts of Pakistan and England.**

**Guru Nanak Jayanti celebrates the birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev, the first among ten Sikh gurus and the founder of the Sikh religion. It is one of the most eagerly awaited occasions of the year by the Sikh community. The year 2020 marked the 551st birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev. Gurudwaras across the world are decked up with lights to celebrate the festival, as people exchange greetings and gather to pray together and show their reverence to Guru Nanak Dev.**

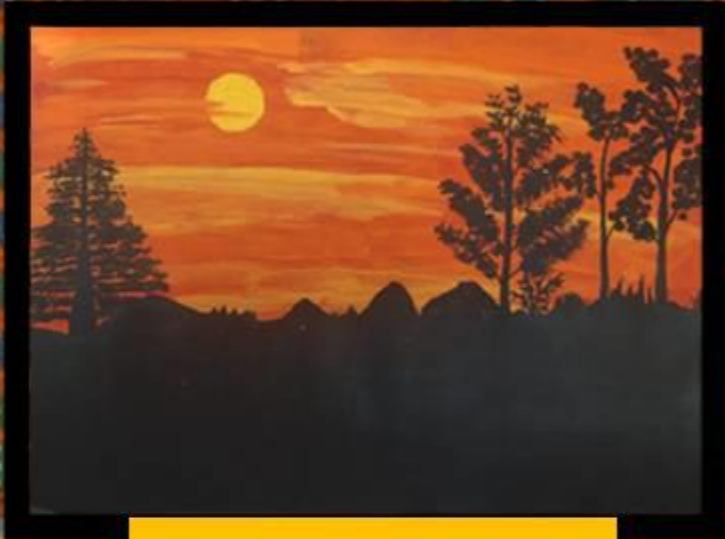
**8. Children's Day — the birth anniversary of Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India.**

**It is celebrated on 14 November every year as a tribute to India's First Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru. 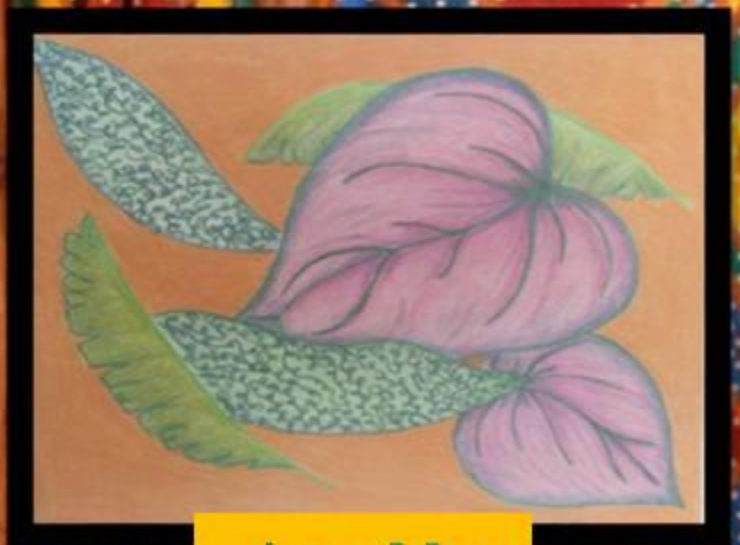

## Inception

Taking inspiration from many sci-fi classics and seamlessly blending it with the ambiance of a James Bond thriller this movie manages to live up to its monumental hype and expectations even ten years after its release.
