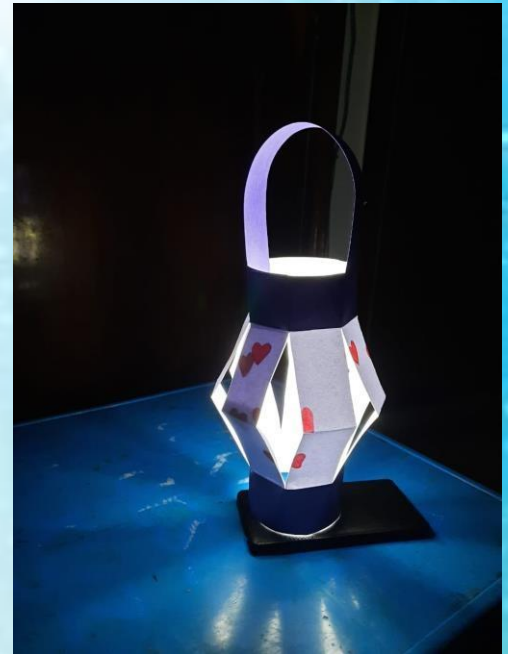

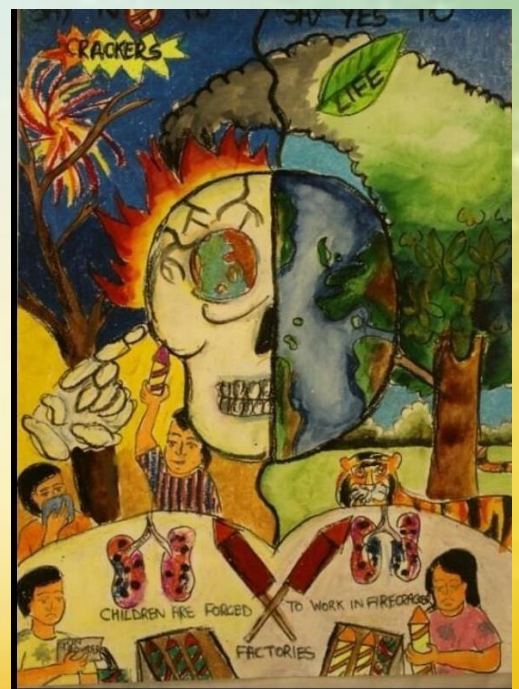
Diwali

1. Diwali is the festival of lights symbolizing the victory of inner light over the spiritual darkness.
2. It is the five-day festival starting with Dhanteras; on which people clean their houses and shop for gold and other utensils.
3. The festival is mainly for all Hindu communities, but some non-Hindu communities celebrate it too.
4. People worship goddess Lakshmi on this day, the goddess of wealth and prosperity in our lives.
5. Rangoli decorations with coloured powder, flour and sand are very popular on Diwali, and it is very auspicious for the occasion.
6. People decorate their houses with clay lamps and electronic lightings to welcome the goddess Lakshmi in their homes.
7. The main day of festival celebrates Lakshmi pooja followed by mouth-watering delicacies and festivities of fireworks.
8. This day also marks the spiritual awakening or the 'nirvana' of lord Mahavir, which is one of the most auspicious occasions in Jainism.
9. In Sikhism, people celebrate this festival as the day when their Sixth Sikh Guru, Hargobind ji had released from imprisonment.
10. Diwali is the festival when families and friends unite together and spread the message of brotherhood, love and unity.

GURU TEG BAHADUR

Guru Teg Bahadur was the ninth guru of Sikhs. He was also the father of tenth Guru, Guru Gobind Singh. Guru Teg Bahadur was born Tyag Mal on April 1, 1621 in Amritsar, Punjab. He was born to sixth Sikh Guru, Guru Hargobind Singh ji and Mata Nanaki. Guru Teg Bahadur is regarded as the most selfless martyr of the country. Every year, 24th November is observed as the Martyrdom day of Guru Teg Bahadur. Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb wanted to convert India into an Islamic country and forced Hindus to convert to Islam or else he would kill them. To save their lives, they sought help from Guru Teg Bahadur. To this, Guru ji asked them to tell Aurangzeb that if he can convert him (Guru Teg Bahadur) to Islam, everybody will follow the suit. When Aurangzeb got to know about the challenge, he arrested Guru Teg Bahadur and his followers. When Guru ji refused to accept, he and his followers were brutally tortured for five days. But even then he refused to bow down to Aurangzeb. When Aurangzeb could not bring Guru ji to submission, he beheaded him in broad daylight. The sacrifice of Guru Teg Bahadur teaches us that we should work selflessly for the betterment of our nation.
