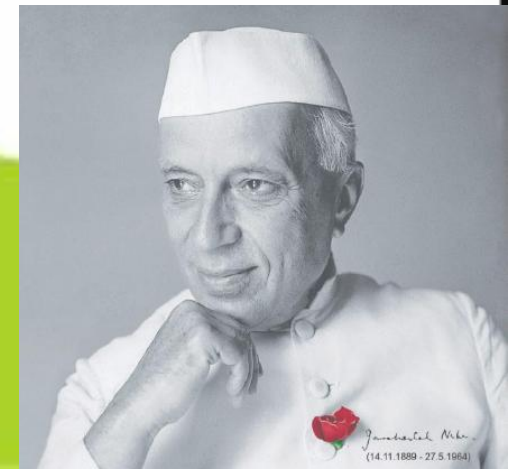
Christmas

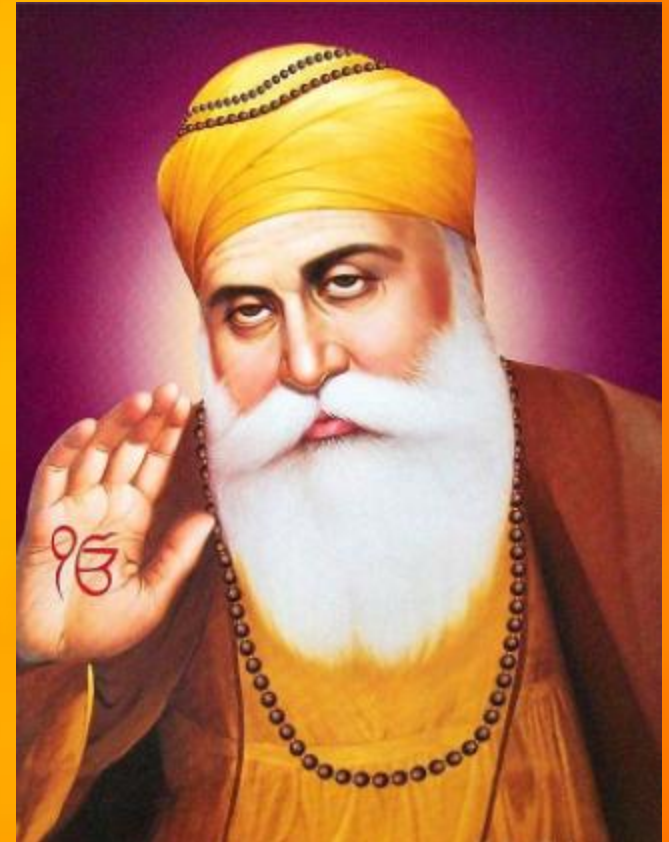
Children's Day

Dust on the Mountains

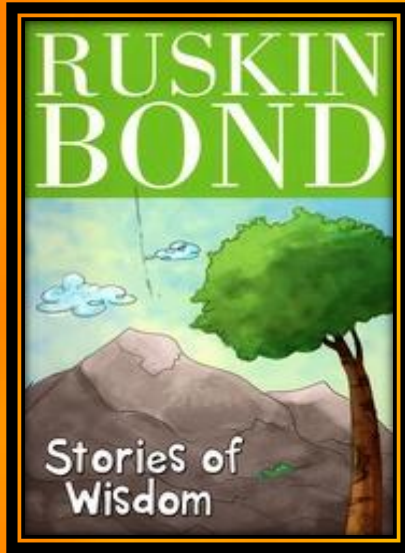

LET'S SHOW GRATITUDE TOWARDS OUR SOLDIERS ON "VIJAY DIWAS"

In India, Vijay Diwas is celebrated every year on 16 December. The war between India and Pakistan began on 3 December 1971, lasting 13 days and officially ending on 16 December. After this war the Pakistani army surrendered to the Indian armed forces. The head of the Pakistan Army, General AA Khan Niazi, with 93,000 soldiers, surrendered before the Indian Army and Mukti Bahani of Bangladesh.
