Constitution Day

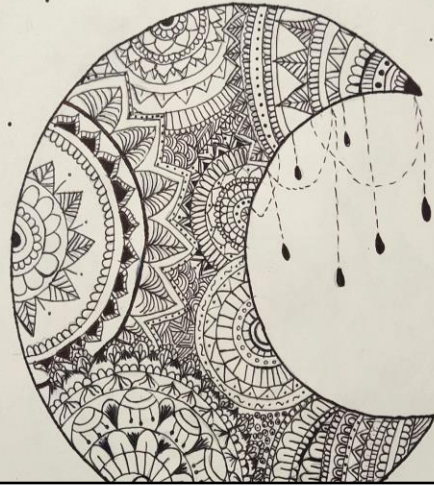

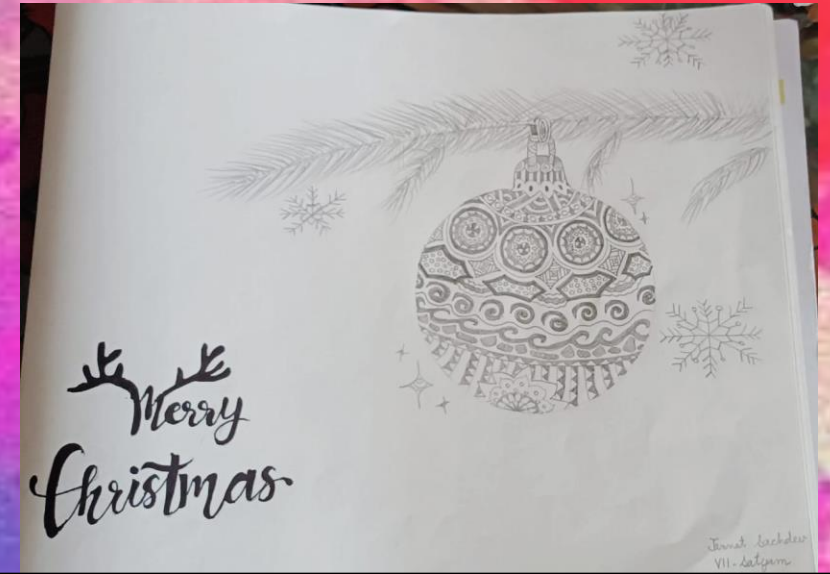



5. Saint Nickolas, who would eventually be called Santa Claus, was originally the patron saint of children, thieves and pawnbrokers!
6. December 28th is considered by some to be the unluckiest day of the year.

7. The first artificial Christmas tree was made in Germany, fashioned out of goose feathers that are dyed green!
 8. Spiders and spider webs are considered good luck on Christmas.
 9. Common decorations on a Christmas tree each have their specific meanings. Candles – the light of the world, the Star at the top is a reminder of the first Christmas night and Candy canes are to represent the Shepherd’s cane.
 10. “Jingle bells” was composed in 1857, and not for Christmas – it was meant to be a Thanksgiving song!
 11. An ancient legend states that forest animals can speak in human language on Christmas Eve!

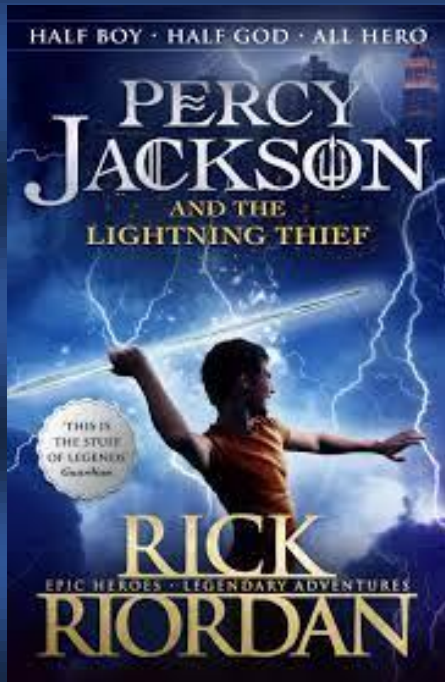

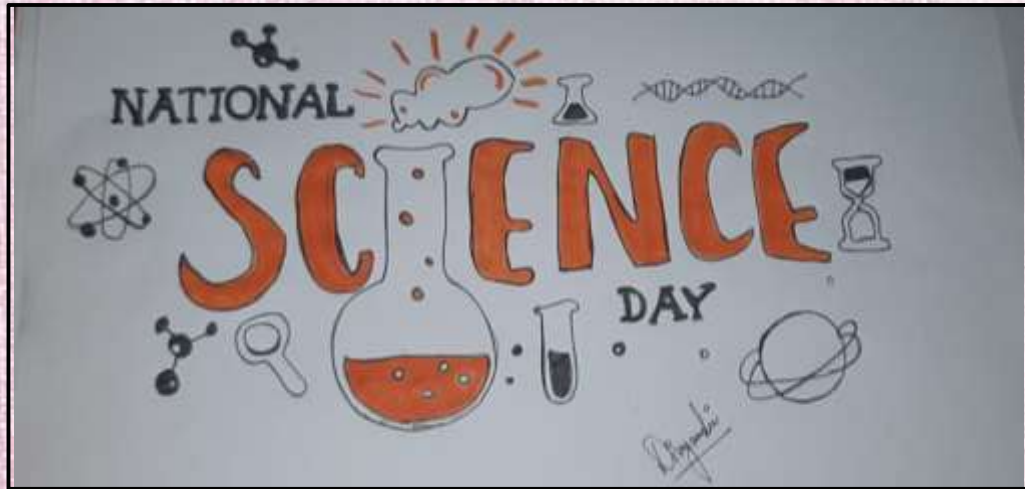
Diwali- The Festival of Lights:

He was the first preacher of Sikhism and is the First Guru. The first full moon of Kartika month every year is celebrated as Guru Parba. In his birthplace, a big fair is organized to celebrate his birth anniversary. Born in a poor Khatri family, he was a very intelligent child. Everyone was fascinated by his way of seeing the world. His parents were Mehta Kalu and Mata Tripta. He studied in a local school in his village and outsmarted every kid studying with him. His love and passion for mankind made him popular among the villagers. He was very creative too. Since his childhood, he hymned musical poetries all the time. All these hymns are now scribed in Guru Granth Sahib, the Holy Book of Sikhism. When he grew younger, he used to work as a storekeeper. He gave all his earnings to the needy and kept a very small amount for himself. One day, he went to the Kalibai River for a bath. It was then God instructed him to become the preacher of peace, love, unity, and fraternity. He became a saint and started spreading love and peace in his words. All his teachings and hymns are written in Guru Granth Sahib, the holy book of Sikhism. He died at an age of 70 years in 1539. His disciples did not find a body but rather discovered a pile of flowers. His words still find relevance in this modern world.

Some Interesting Facts Airplanes

Airplanes are designed to withstand lightning strikes
Planes are designed to be struck by lightning—and they regularly are hit. It's estimated lightning strikes each aircraft once a year—or once per every 1,000 hours of flight time.

- On December 17, 1903, **Wilbur and Orville Wright** made four brief flights at Kitty Hawk with their first powered aircraft. The Wright brothers had invented the first successful airplane. The Wrights used this stopwatch to time the Kitty Hawk flights.
- Most commercial aircraft are approved to fly at a maximum of **around 42,000 feet**. This maximum is also known as a 'service ceiling.' For example, for the double-decker Airbus A380 'superjumbo' this ceiling is 43,000 feet. Meanwhile, for the Boeing 787-8 and -9 'Dreamliner,' it is 43,100 feet
