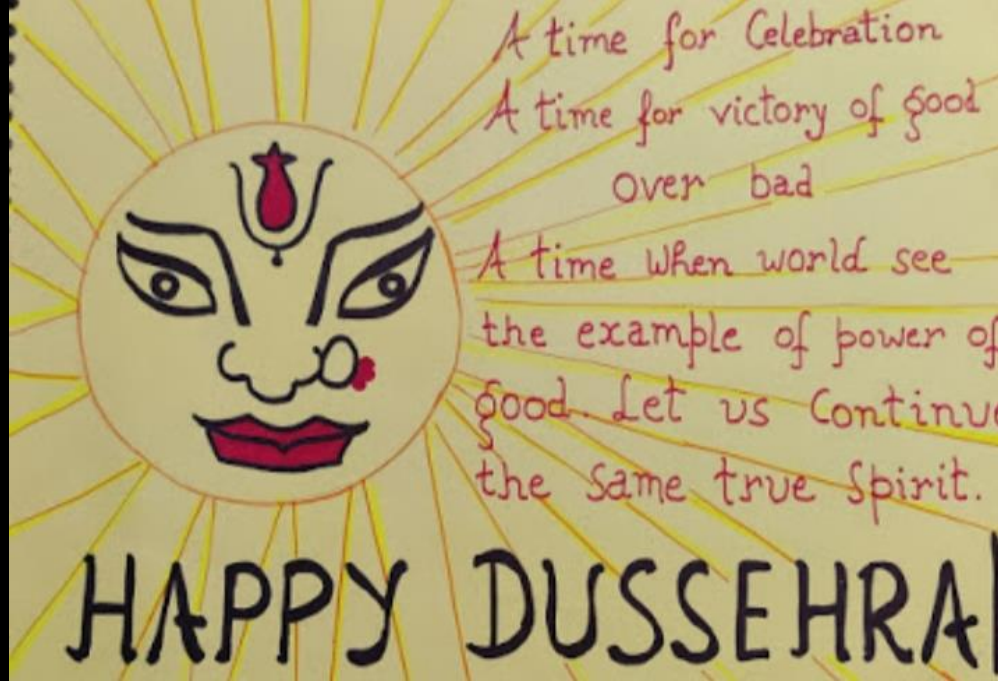

- Threat Potent



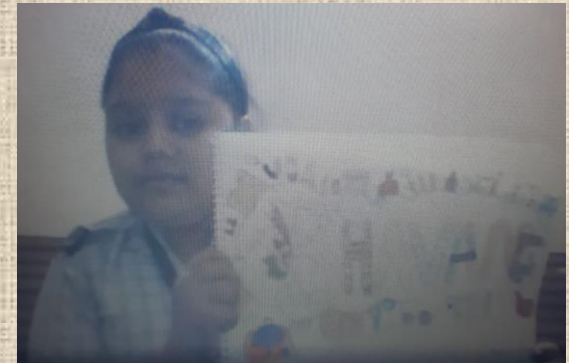
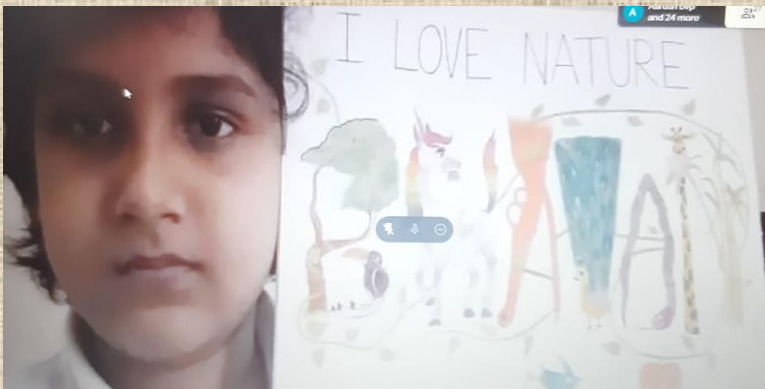
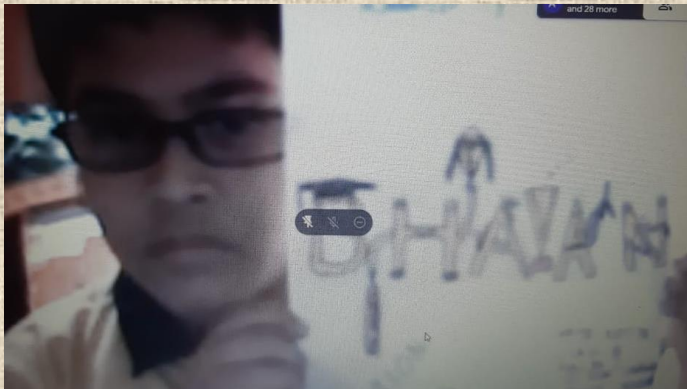
BACKGROUND OF THE TRAGEDY

Japan was a fierce enemy of the US and its allies — Britain, China and the Soviet Union — during the World War II. Japanese forces decided to take an aim at Indo-china with the intention of capturing the oil-rich areas of the East Indies. The Japanese had publicly stated their intent to fight to the bitter end, and were using tactics such as Kamikaze attacks, in which pilots would suicide-dive against US warships. **U.S. President Harry Truman** ordered to destroy the cities to force Japan to surrender in **WW2**. The consent of the United Kingdom was obtained for the bombing under the Quebec Agreement and orders were issued for atomic bombs to be used against Japanese cities. This was because the aim was to destroy Japan's ability to fight wars.

Hiroshima and Nagasaki were chosen to be bombed because Hiroshima was the seventh-largest city of Japan at the time and served as the headquarters of the Second Army and the Chugoku Regional Army. This made it one of the most important military command stations in the country. The bombing was targeted to weaken Japan in strength and economically.

GANDHI JAYANTI

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi (1869-1948) was one of the few men in history to fight simultaneously on moral, religious, political, social, economic, and cultural fronts. During his time as a lawyer in South Africa. He developed his strategy of non-violence

(The idea of opposing unjust laws by non-violent protest). He led the Indian National Congress party in three major campaigns against British rule, each culminating in his arrest. Nevertheless, Gandhi's life and thought had an enormous impact on the Indian nation, and he continues to be widely revered--known before and after his assassination as Mahatma, the Great Soul.

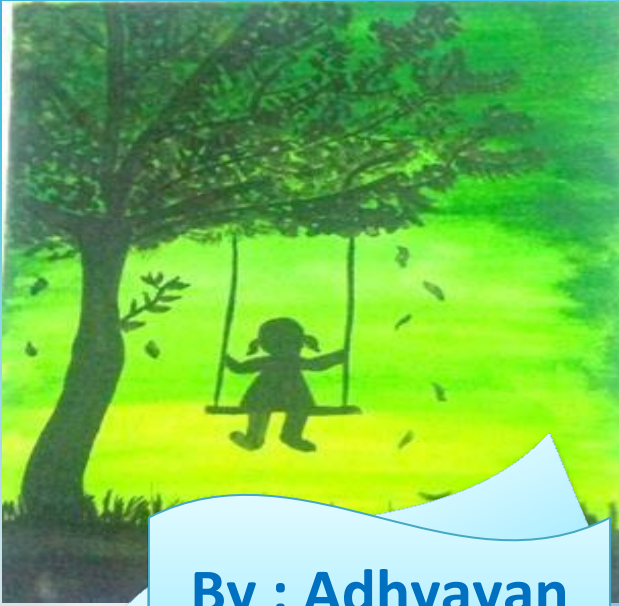
Festivals of October

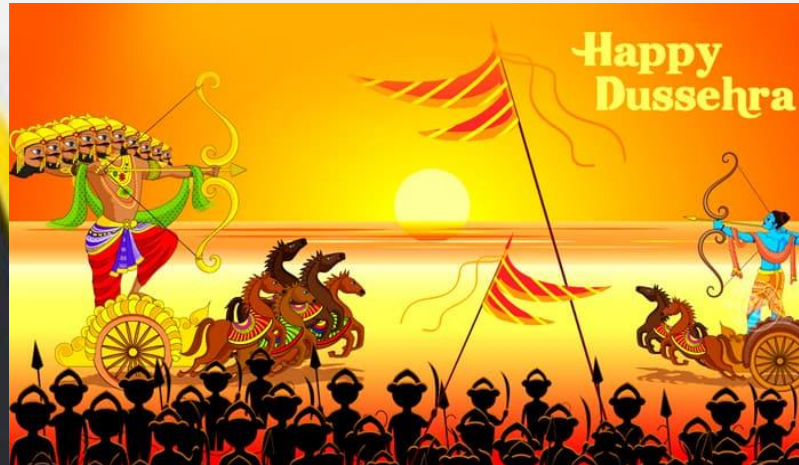
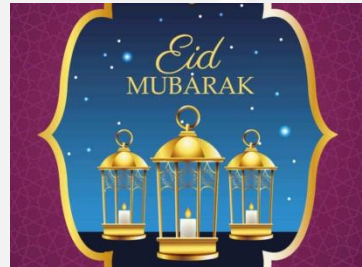

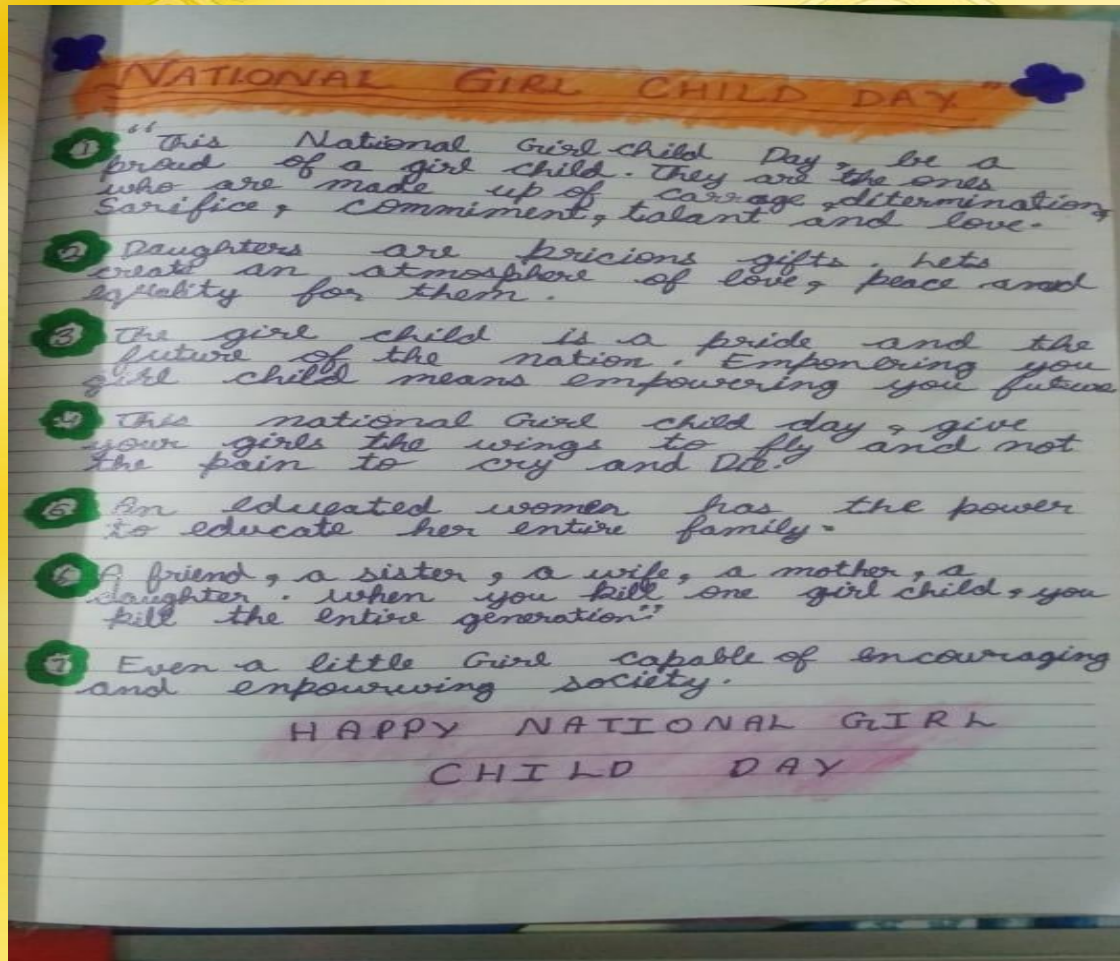

A.P.J Abdul Kalam



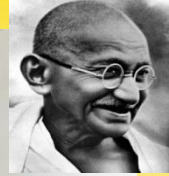
Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam was born on October 15 1931 at Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu. He completed his studies in St. Joseph's College, Trichy. He worked as a scientist, author, professor, engineer and administrator. He was an aerospace engineer who developed several spacecrafts. He is popularly known as the "Missile Man". He worked under the Defence Research and Development Organisation [DRDO] and later the Indian Space Research Organisation [ISRO] as a Science Administrator. He served as the 11th president of India during 2002-2007. He was in-charge for many popular missiles like AGNI, PRITHVI, TRISHUL, AKASH, NAG etc. He was the scientist who launched the SLV-3 in India. He is awarded the Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan, Bharat Ratna. Sadly, he expired on 27 July 2015, Shillong. The world still remembers him for his remarkable achievements. His birthday is celebrated as Students' day all around the globe.

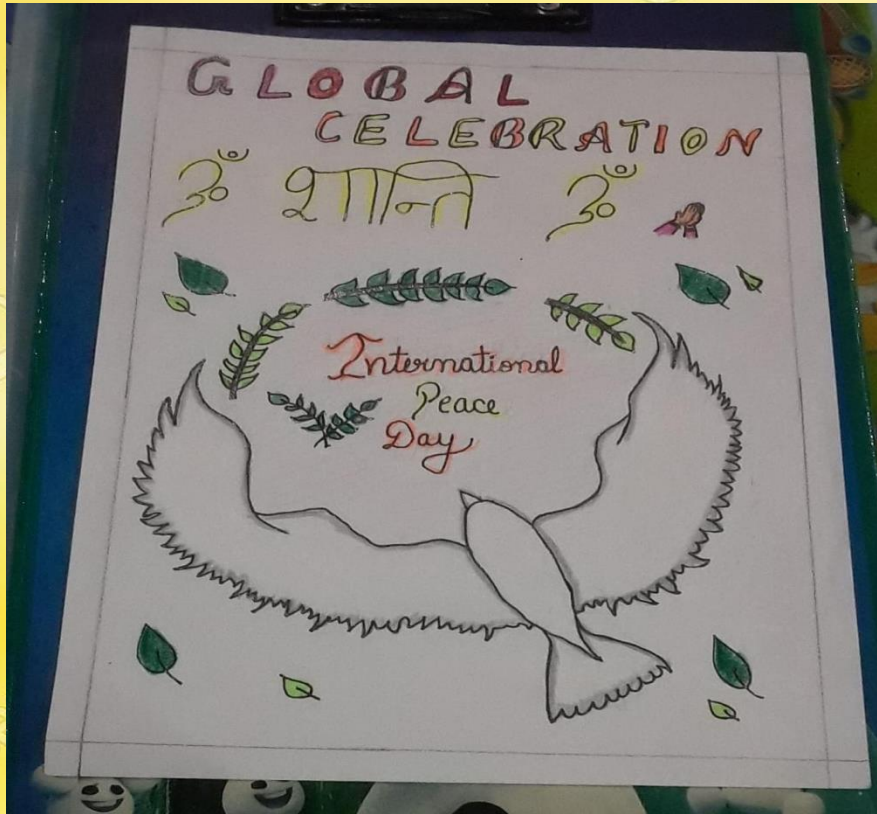

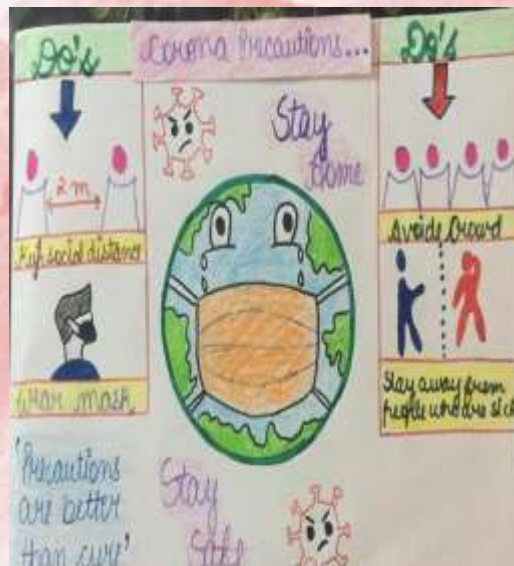
