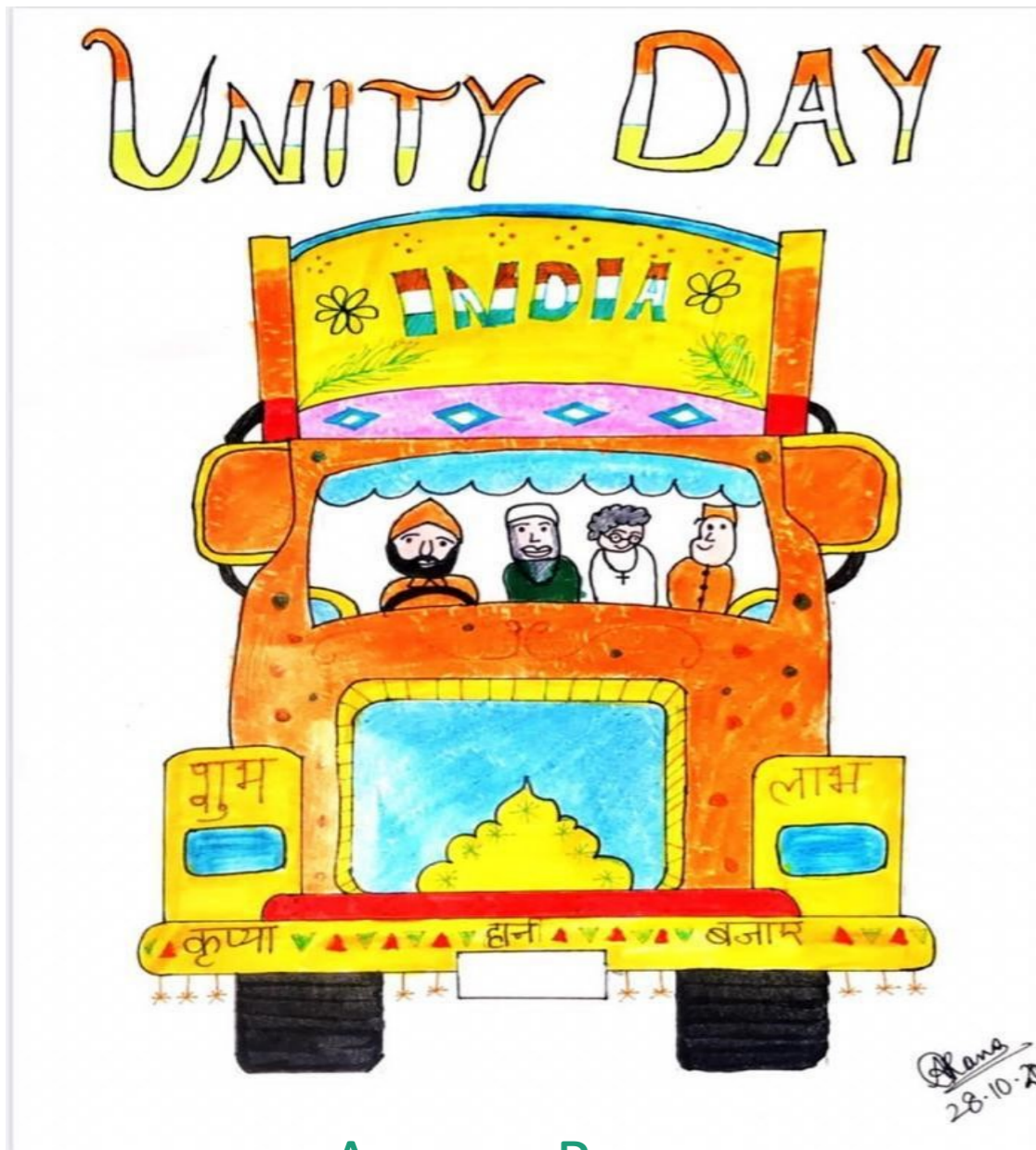


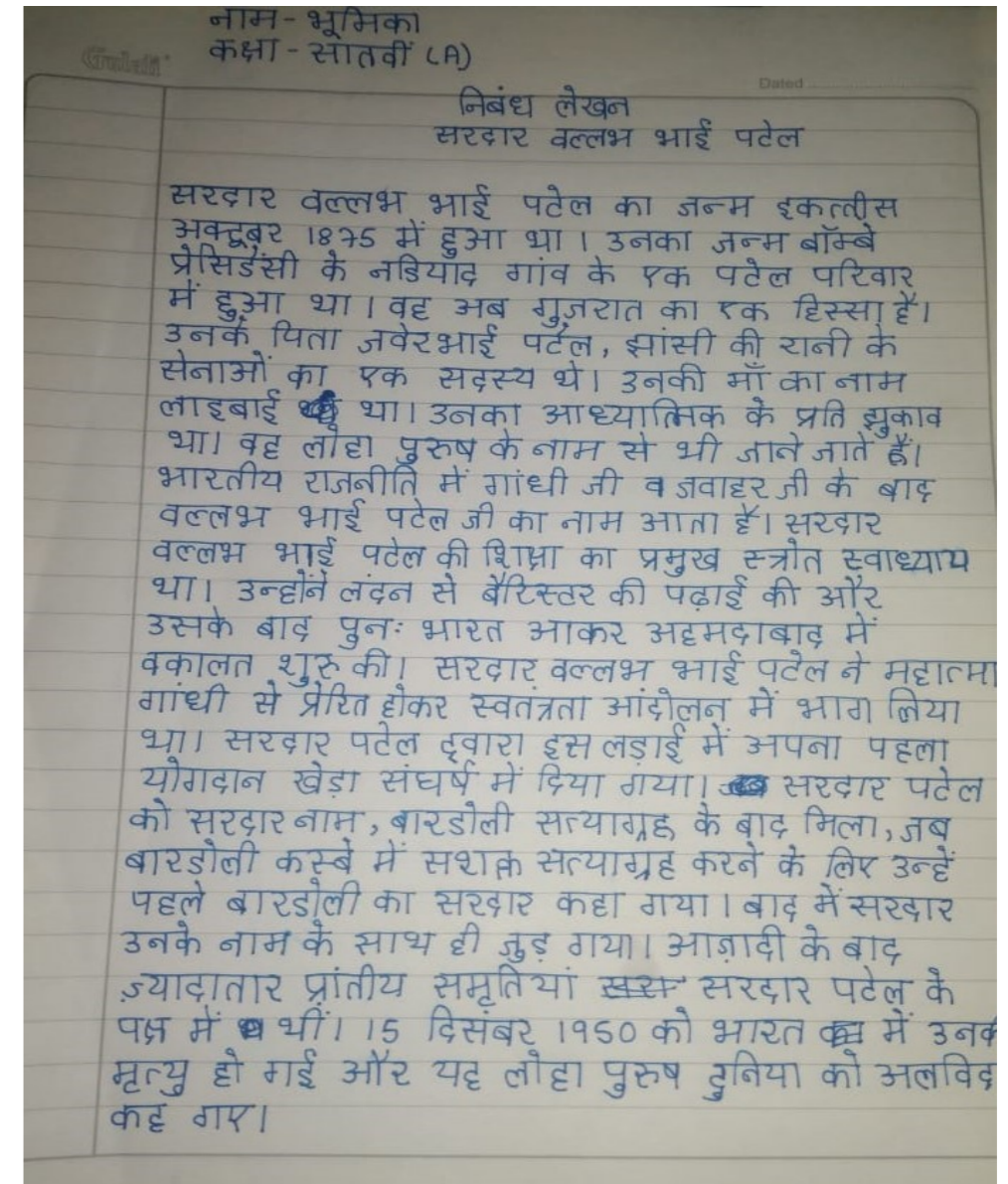

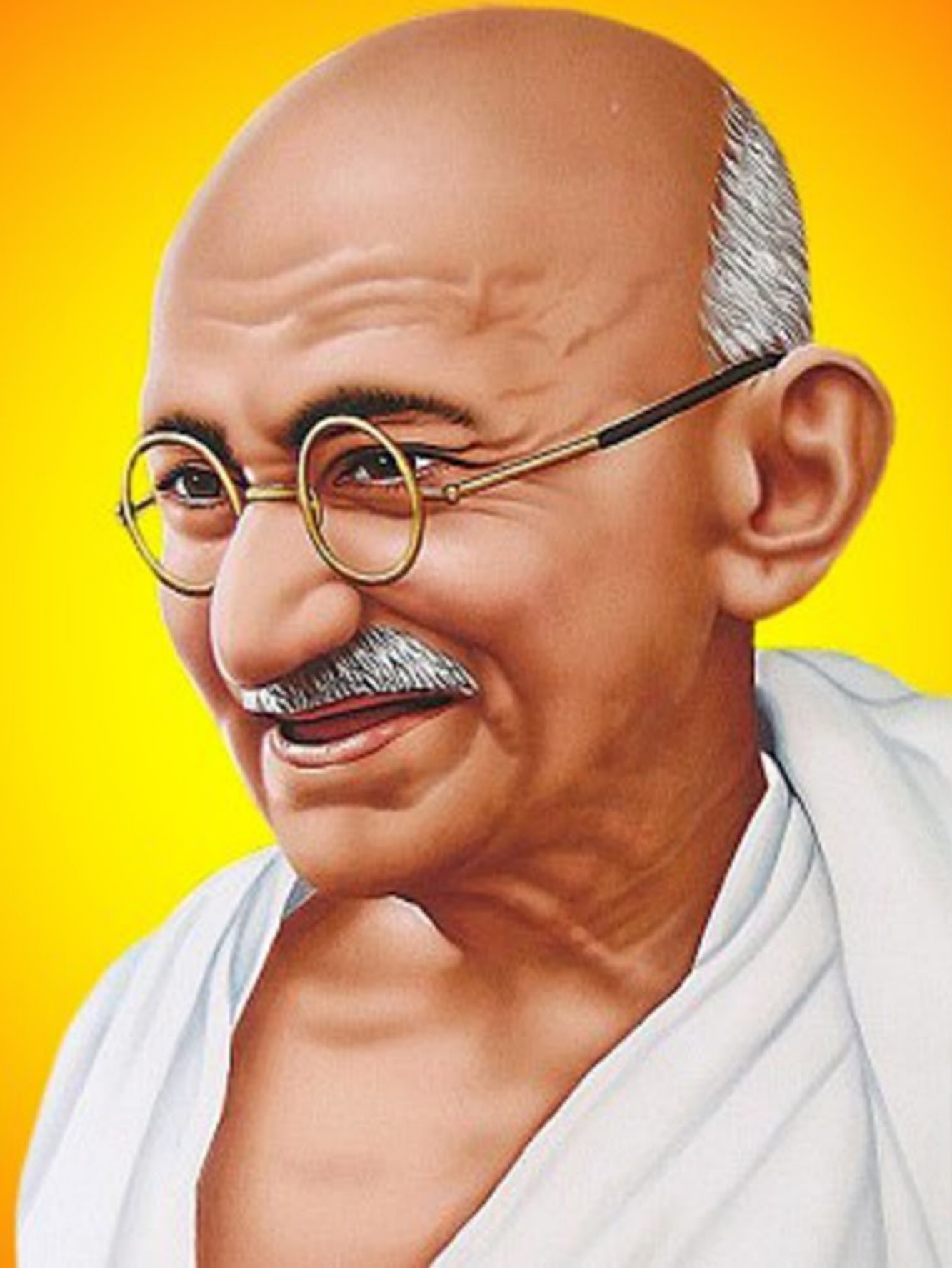

DUSSEHRA

Dussehra, widely known as Vijayadashami, is one of the most important Hindu festivals of India. It is celebrated on Navaratri, a few weeks before Diwali, around September or October. In some parts of India, it marks the victory of Warrior Goddess Durga over Demon Mahishasura. In contrast, in others, it marks Rama's Victory over Ravana. Dussehra is celebrated with much vigour and enthusiasm in India. Many customs and rituals are followed for Dussehra puja, which varies from area to area.

Some people even keep a fast for the entire day to get blessings from Goddess Durga. Streets and buildings are decorated with lights, and firecrackers are burnt. Plays like Ram Lila are organized, and people gather around in new clothes to enjoy the show. Fairs are also arranged, and stalls are put up where food, toys, and dresses are sold. The festival ends with burning the statues of Ravana, Meghnath, and Kumbhakarna, which shows the ultimate victory of good over evil.

SARDAR VALLABHAI PATEL

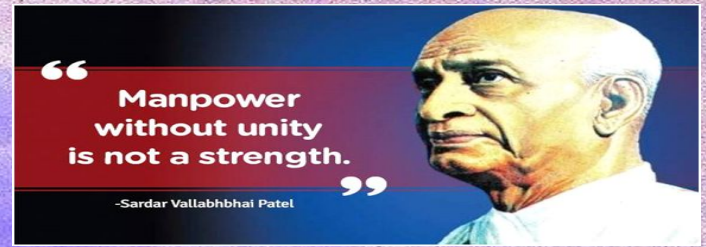
Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, remembered as iron man of India was a great man, visionary statesman, and pure patriot of India.

Happiness is a feeling that doesn't come to us but we have to find it.

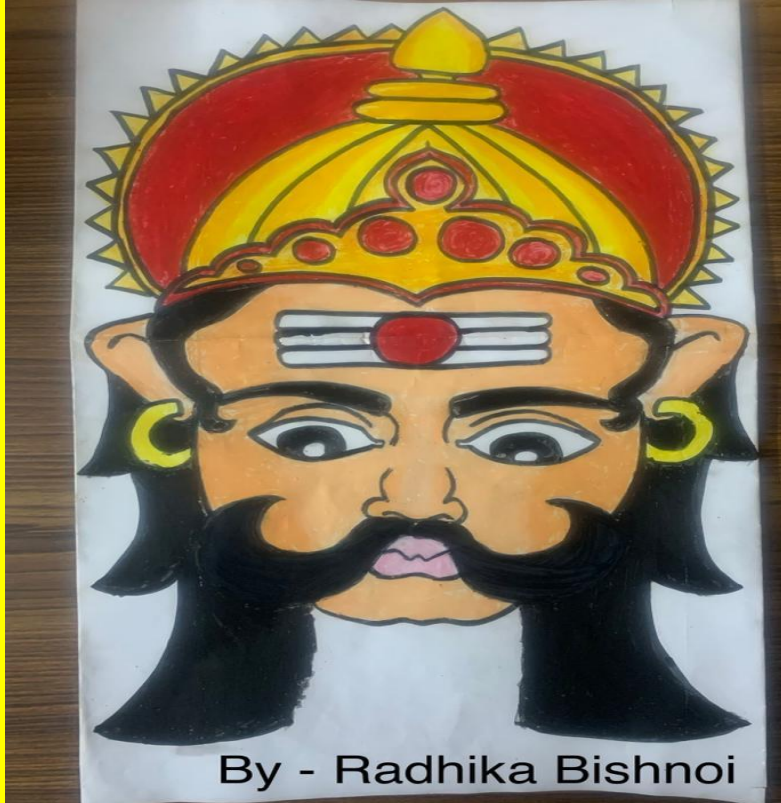

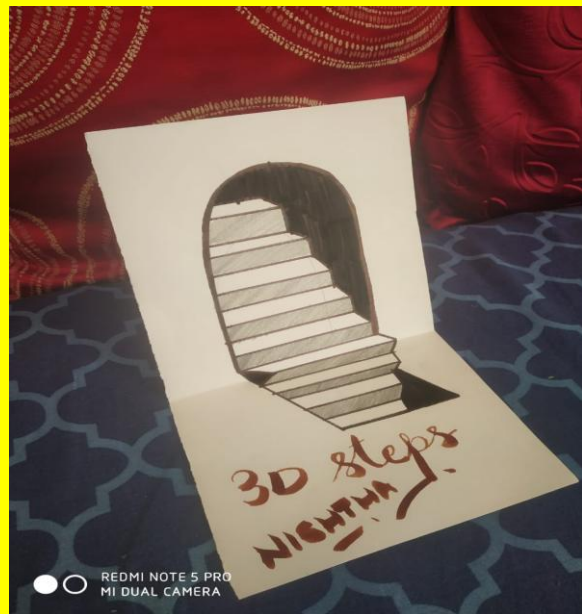

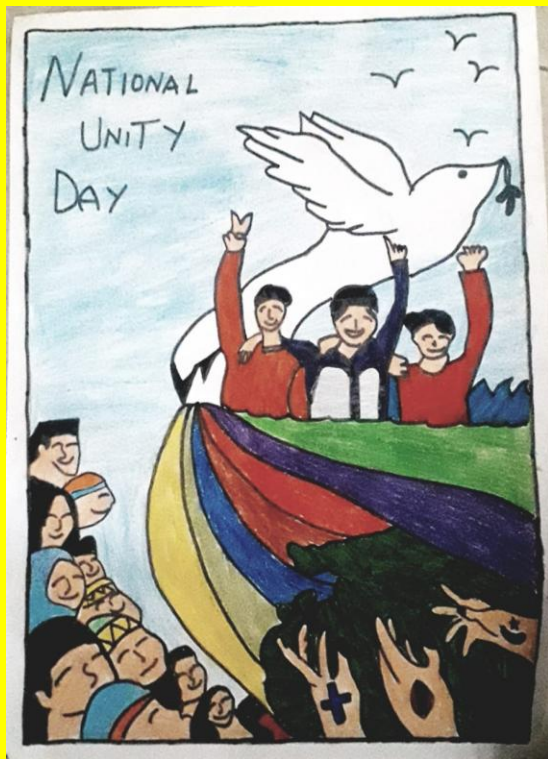

Global Handwashing Day

Handwashing with soap is the most effective and inexpensive way to prevent diarrhoea and acute respiratory infections, which take the lives of millions of children in developing countries every year. Together, they are responsible for the majority of all child deaths. Yet, despite its lifesaving potential, handwashing with soap is seldom practised and difficult to promote. The challenge is to transform handwashing with soap from an abstract good idea into an automatic behaviour performed in homes, schools, and communities worldwide. Turning handwashing with soap before eating and after using the toilet into an ingrained habit could save more lives than any single vaccine or medical intervention, cutting deaths from diarrhoea by almost half and deaths from acute respiratory infections by one-quarter. A vast change in handwashing behaviour is critical to meeting the Millennium Development Goal of reducing deaths among children under the age of five by two-thirds by 2015.

Global Handwashing Day is observed every year on 15th October every year in an effort to raise awareness of handwashing with soap as a key approach to disease prevention. As a campaign it aims to motivate and mobilize millions around the world to wash their hands with soap. Although people around the world wash their hands with water, very few wash their hands with soap at the critical occasions. More handwashing with soap means lower rates of infectious disease. The Global Handwashing Day took place for the first time on October 15, 2008, the date appointed by UN General Assembly in accordance with year 2008 as the International Year of Sanitation. The theme for Global Handwashing Day's inaugural year was Focus on School Children.

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF THE GIRL CHILD



International Day of the Girl Child is an international observance day declared by the United Nations; it is also called the Day of Girls and the International Day of the Girl. October 11, 2012, was the first Day of the Girl Child. The observation supports more opportunity for girls and increases awareness of gender inequality faced by girls worldwide based upon their gender. This inequality includes areas such as access to education, nutrition, legal rights, medical care, and protection from discrimination, violence against women and forced child marriage. The celebration of the day also "reflects the successful emergence of girls and young women as a distinct cohort in development policy, programming, campaigning and research.

International Day of the Girl increases awareness of issues faced by girls around the world. Many global development plans do not include or consider girls, and their issues become "invisible. More than 62 million girls around the world had no access to education, as of c. 2014, according to USAID. Worldwide and collectively, girls ages 5 to 14 spend more than 160 million hours more on household chores than boys of the same age do. Globally, one in four girls are married before age 18. On October 11, 2016, Emma Watson, a United Nations Women's Goodwill Ambassador, urged countries and families worldwide to end forced child marriage. Many girls around the world are vulnerable to acts of sexual violence and the perpetrators often go unpunished. The Day of Girls helps raise awareness not only of the issues that girls face, but also of what is

likely to happen when those problems are solved. For example, educating girls helps reduce the rate of child marriage, disease and helps strengthen the economy by helping girls have access to higher paying jobs.

The International Day of Girls initiative began as a project of Plan International, a non-governmental organization that operates worldwide. The idea for an international day of observance and celebration grew out of Plan

This year, under the theme, “My voice, our equal future”, let's seize the opportunity to reimagine a better world inspired by adolescent girls – energized and recognized, counted and invested in.

Ballabhai Ghaverbhai Patel had patriotism running in his veins. After all his father Ghaverbhai Patel fought in the army of Queen of Ghansi Samrat during the revolt of 1857. He was born on 31 October 1875 in Nadiad, Gujarat. He met Mahatma Gandhi in October 1917 and so started his journey in the Indian Independence movement and politics. Sardar Patel contributed in many ways during the freedom struggle. He used strength and determination to unite the many Indian princely states to form one country. When India gained independence, there were over 550 princely states, these states varied in size and might, in most cases reluctant to join the Indian Union. Integration of these states and building the Indian Republic.

Patel oversaw the transformation of administration in a phased way. This earned him the moniker "Uniter of India".

He worked extensively with the civil servants and lawmakers to establish unified nationwide systems. Though a Sanskrit in Hindi, Patel had a deep appreciation for the diverse culture of India. Truly a leader whose birthday ought to be celebrated as 'Unity Day'.

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel was born on 31st October 1875 in Patel Panchayat community in Nadiad village in Gujarat. His full name was Sardar Vallabhbhai Ghaverbhai Patel. Sardar Patel is popularly known as the 'Iron Man of India' or 'Bismarck of Modern India'.

Being a child, he displayed qualities of organisation and leadership that marked him out for his future role. In childhood, he organised a successful strike of his classmates that lasted for three days to teach a lesson to one of the teachers who was unduly fond of the rod.

In the year 1928 when the Bardoli Satyagraha Patel successfully led the agitation of Zamindars of Bardoli against the increased taxes after the successful leadership in the Bardoli, he was awarded the title of "Sardar", which means "Leader".

The first home minister as well as the first Deputy Prime Minister of independent India, Information Minister and Minister of State, Vallabhbhai was responsible for the integration of hundreds of princely states into the modern Republic of India in less than a year's time. The integration of the states could certainly be termed as the crowning achievement of Vallabhbhai Patel's life.

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's birth anniversary 31st October (date of birth of Sardar Patel) is marked as Rashtriya Ekta Diwas or National Unity day every year.

Dedicated to Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the Statue of Unity (the world's tallest statue) was built on the state of Gujarat, India.

Last but not the least, I would like to end by a famous quote of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel "My only desire is that India should be a good producer and no one should be hungry, shivering for food in the country."

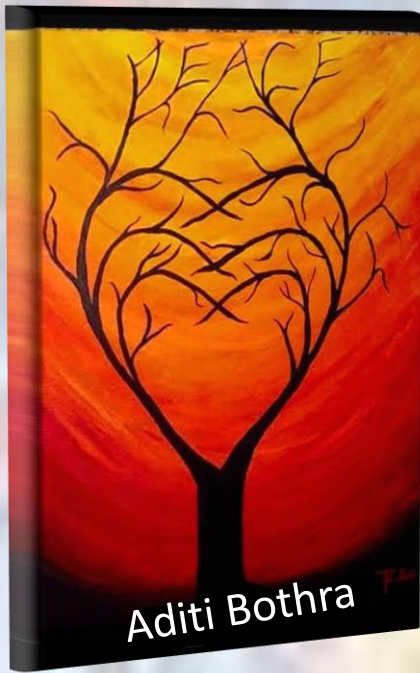
