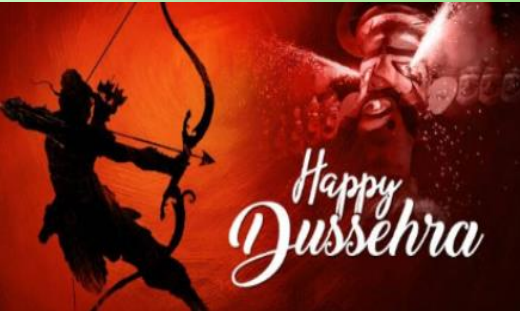

Victory Of Good Over Evil

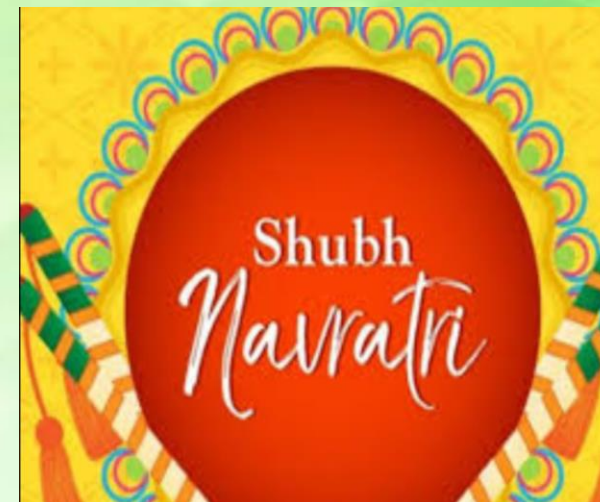

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel The Real Hero...

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the Iron Man of India was born on 31 October 1875 in Nadiad, Gujarat. His full name was 'Sardar Vallabhbhai Thaverbhai Patel'. His father's name was Thaverbhai Patel and his mother's name was load Bai. He is remembered as a very strong and dynamic freedom fighter of India. Therefore his contributions and patriotism towards India is today celebrated as Rashtriya Ekta Divas (on his Birth anniversary) on 31st October. He became the first home minister and deputy Prime Minister of India. His life is an inspiring and motivating one. People not just India but also in other countries take inspiration from him. But his life was not that easy; he faced many challenges in his life. Patel wanted to become a lawyer and spent years studying on his own with books borrowed from other lawyers. He cleared his examination within two years. And he became one of the most successful lawyers of the country. He was totally devoted for his country India that on Gandhi's call, Patel quit his job and joined the movement to fight for exemption of taxes in Kheda at the time of plague and famine. While talking about him remember his saying 'There is something unique in this soil which despite of obstacles it has always examined the abode of great souls' with shows his love, patriotism and loyalty towards his nation. So in his honour on his 143rd Birth anniversary our Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji unveiled a statue of him, called the statue of 'Unity' in Gujarat. His statue teaches us the path of Unity which reminds his his famously said quote that every Indian should now forget that he is a Rajput, a Sikh or a Jat. He must remember that he is an Indian and he has every right in his country but with certain duties.

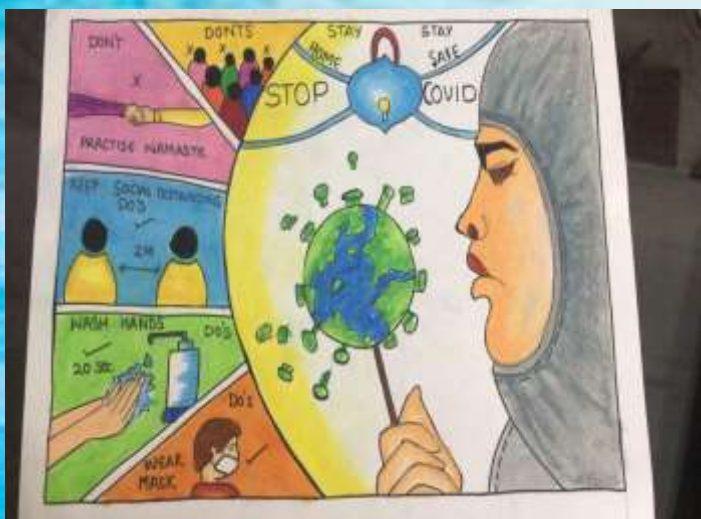

Sardar Vallabhai Patel

Sardar Vallabhai Jhaverbhai Patel popularly known as Sardar Patel or "Bismarck of India" or "The Ironman of India" was an Indian Politician. He was very strong and spirited freedom fighter. He was also elected for the post of Home Minister soon after India got independence. He also served as the First Deputy Prime Minister of India. This dynamic leader of India was born on 13th October 1875 in a city called Nadiad. The name of his father was "Jhaverbhai Patel" and the name of his mother was "Ladba". He used to help his father in farming since childhood and studied in a school called N.K. High School, Petlad. He passed his High-school examination in 1896. Throughout school he was a very wise and intelligent student. He believed in Unity and he was one of the leaders who brought people of the country together. He played a vital role in the integration of the country after independence. He was very close to our father of our nation Shri Mahatma Gandhi Ji and also joined Indian National Congress. With great wisdom and political foresight, he consolidated the small kingdoms. The public was with him because he had full of trust in them. He tackled the Nizam of Hyderabad and the Nawab of Junagarh who initially did not want to join India. Patel was known amongst nationalists as "Gandhi Ji's Lieutenant", and he enjoyed considerable support and respect in Congress for his decisive and straight-forward leadership. His career as a lawyer was also very successful. After completing his matriculation at 22, he passed the district pleader's examination. He then began to practise law, setting up his independent office in Godhra. Two years later, he moved to Borsad, before going to Middle Temple, London, in 1910 for further study in law. He returned to India in February 1913 and served as a well-known criminal lawyer in Ahmedabad. Last to last year on 30th of October a statue of Sardar Patel was also established on the banks of the river Narmada as a sign of unity. This prominent leader took his last breath on 15 December 1950 at the age of 75 in Mumbai. He died due to a Heart Attack. I would like to end my essay with a beautiful saying of his: "Manpower without Unity not a strength unless it is harmonized and united properly then it becomes a spiritual power".

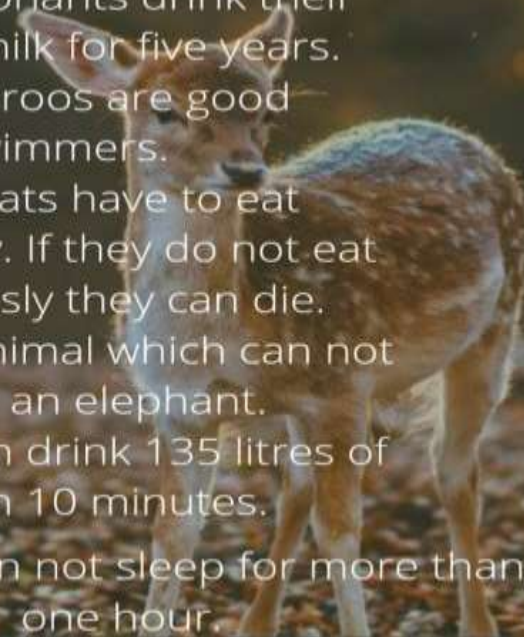

10. The owl can rotate its head to 270 degrees.



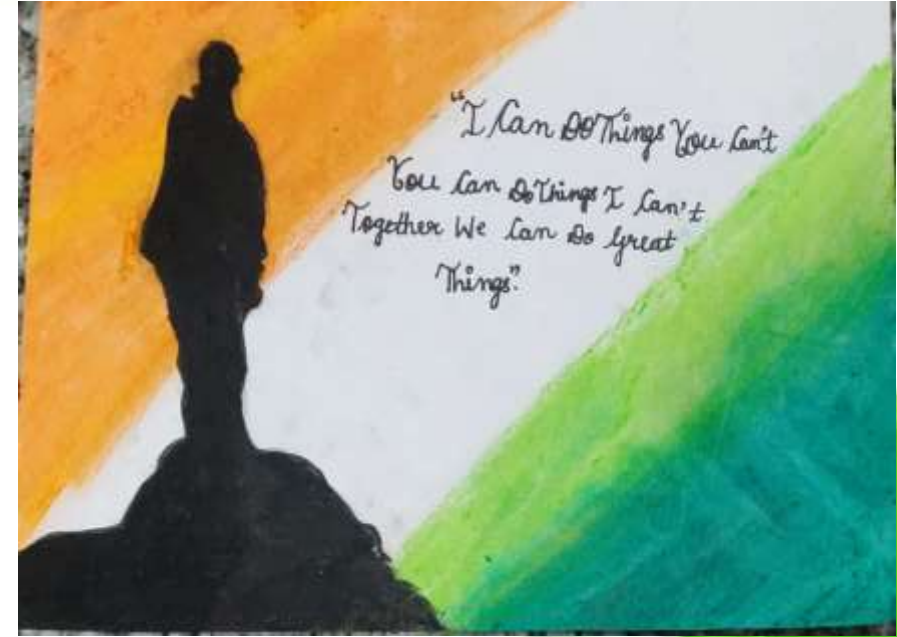

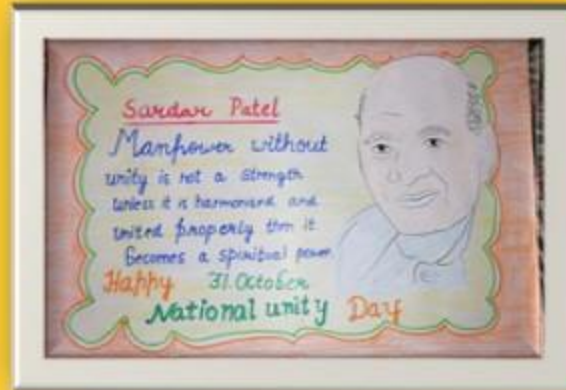

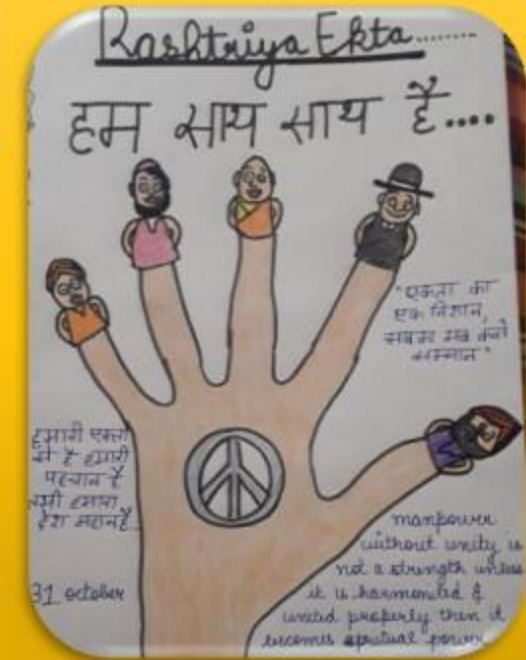

Greetings! Today we will talk about PHISHING. Phishing is the fraudulent attempt to obtain sensitive information or data, such as usernames, passwords and credit card details, by disguising oneself as a trustworthy entity in an electronic communication such as DM, E-mail, text messaging, etc. Phishing is one of the popular unethical hacking techniques used by hackers. Let's have a look at a few ways to protect ourselves from phishing :-

1. **HTTPS** – In order to dodge phishing attacks, we must enter our username and password only when the connection is secured. The website should have “https” prefix before the site URL.
2. **Check for type errors** – Typo errors can be a sign that an email is dodgy. Therefore, before making any final decision, make sure to notice the typos. Check them all - capitals in the email's subject and a few too many exclamation marks. An example has been given on the right side.
