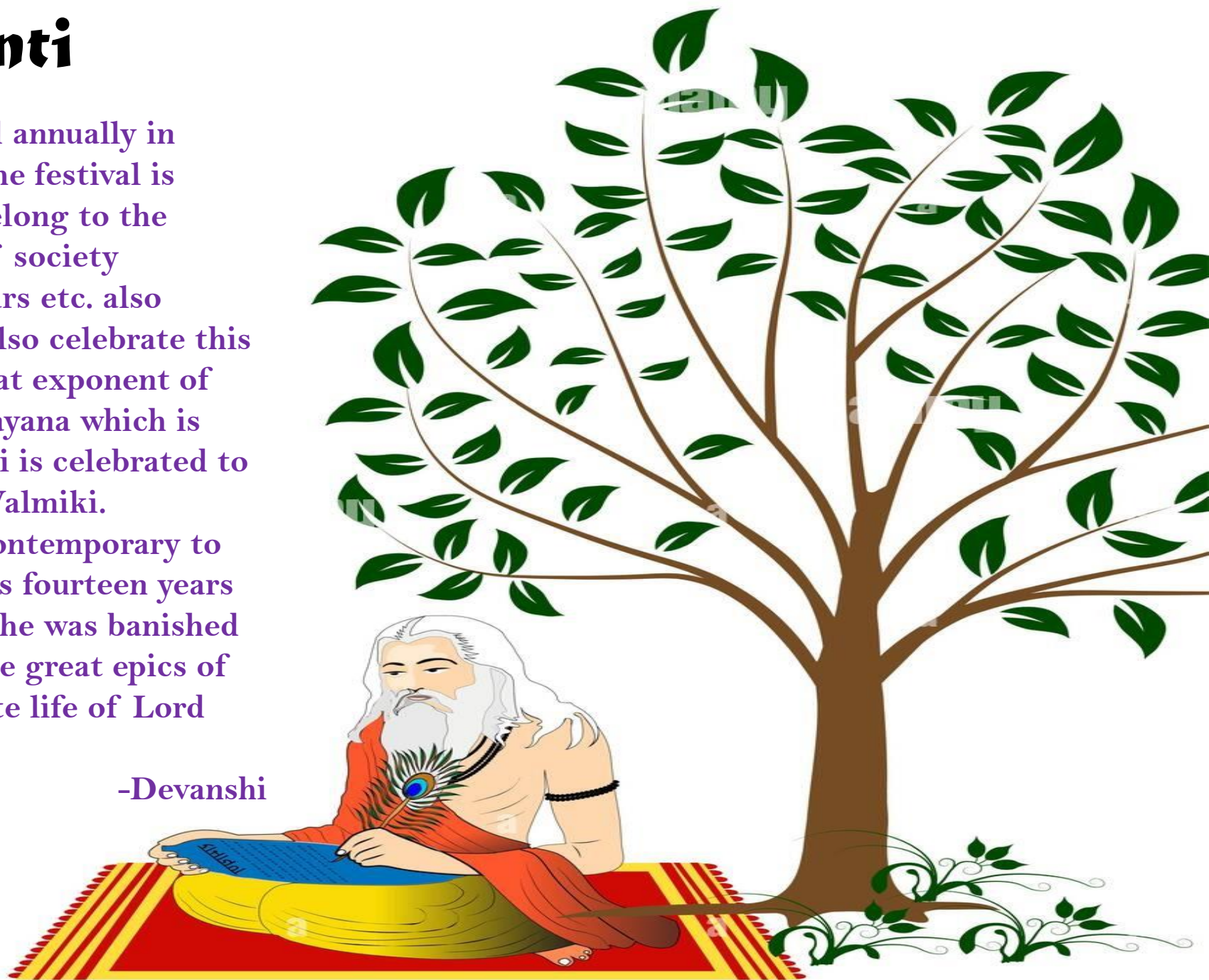


# Valmiki Jayanti

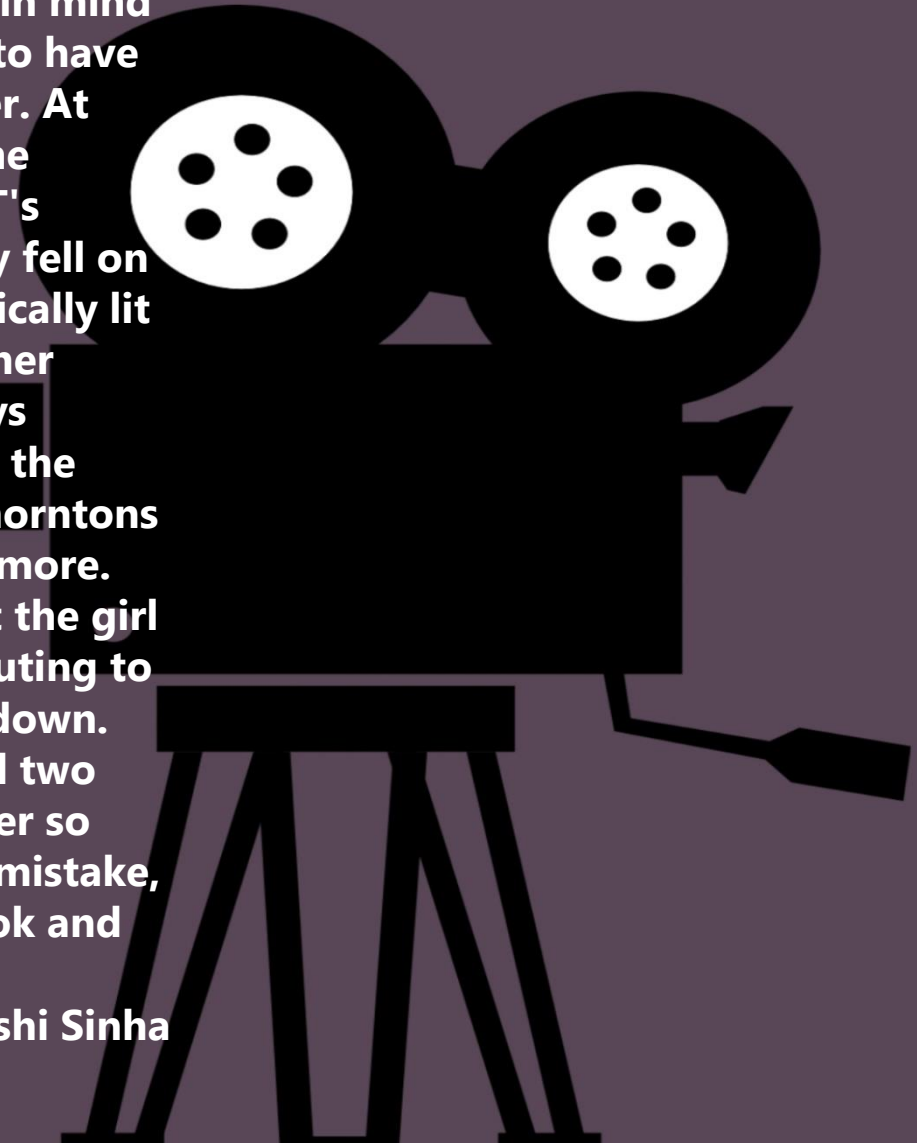

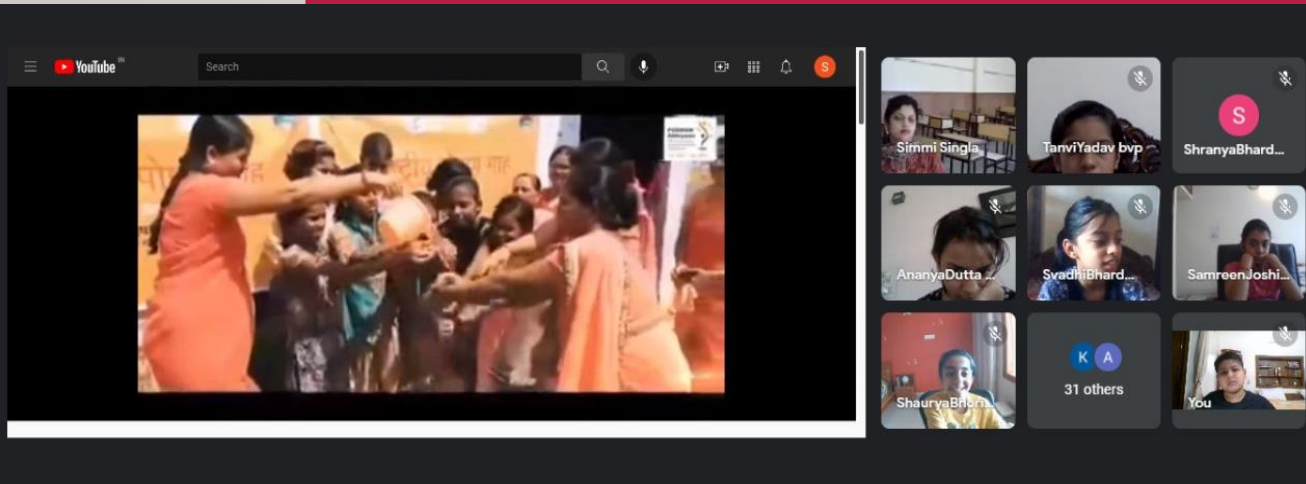

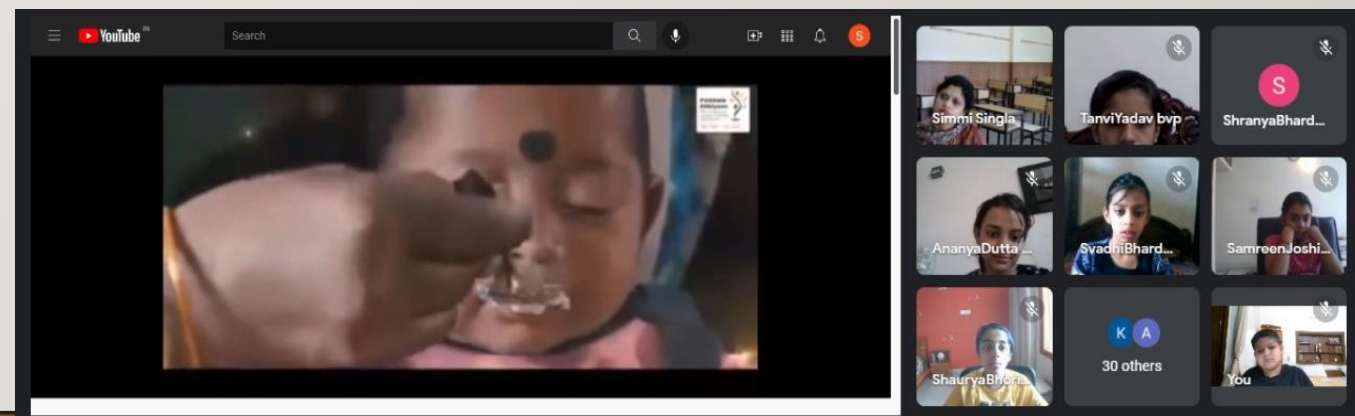

## MAHATMA GANDHI

Topic

Mahatma Gandhi was the most popular leader of the India Independence Movement. He was born in Gujarat family on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 1869 at Porbandar in Gujarat. During his early days as a lawyer he practised law in South Africa and raised voice against the British when he faced discrimination because of his skin colour. He returned India in 1915 and soon joined the Indian National Congress. Thereafter, throughout his life, he fought for the freedom of his motherland following the principles of non-violence and peace. He had a great following and is known as "Father of the India nation." The life of Mahatma Gandhi is indeed an inspiration.



## GANESHA CHATURTHI



Ganesha Chaturthi also known as Vinayaka Chaturthi is an important Hindu festival which holds utmost importance. Ganesha Chaturthi marks the birth anniversary of Lord Ganesha who is the elephant-headed son of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati.

Lord Ganesha is the symbol of education, wisdom, good fortune and prosperity. Lord Ganesha is known with various names such as - Gajanana, Dhoomraketu, Ekdanta, Vakratunda, Siddhi Vinayaka etc.

The festival lasts for 10 days. It begins on the Chaturthi when people install the statue of Lord Ganesha in their homes and ends on Anant Chaturdashi with Ganesha Visarjana or Ganesha Immersion.

Some of the really interesting facts about Ganesha Chaturthi are as follows :

1. Lord Shiva gave a boon to Ganesha that he would be worshipped before any other God.
2. The first Ganesha Chaturthi celebration dates back to the era of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.
3. Bal Gangadhar Tilak started public Ganesha Chaturthi celebrations in 1893 to fight the British.
4. Lord Ganesha is worshipped in countries like Thailand, Cambodia, China, Japan and Nepal.
5. It is considered unlucky to look at the moon during Ganesha Chaturthi.
6. Mumbai's Lalbaugha Raja hosts India's longest immersion procession.
7. It is believed that reciting 108 names of Lord Ganesha during the festival brings good luck to the devotees.
8. Traditionally, the idols of Lord Ganesha are sculpted out of mud and eventually immersed in water and again sculpted next year.
9. Apart from Modaks, Puran Poli also makes as one of the major popular sweets during Ganesha Chaturthi.
10. Ganesha's vehicle is rat and Lord Ganesha is lovingly called Bappa.

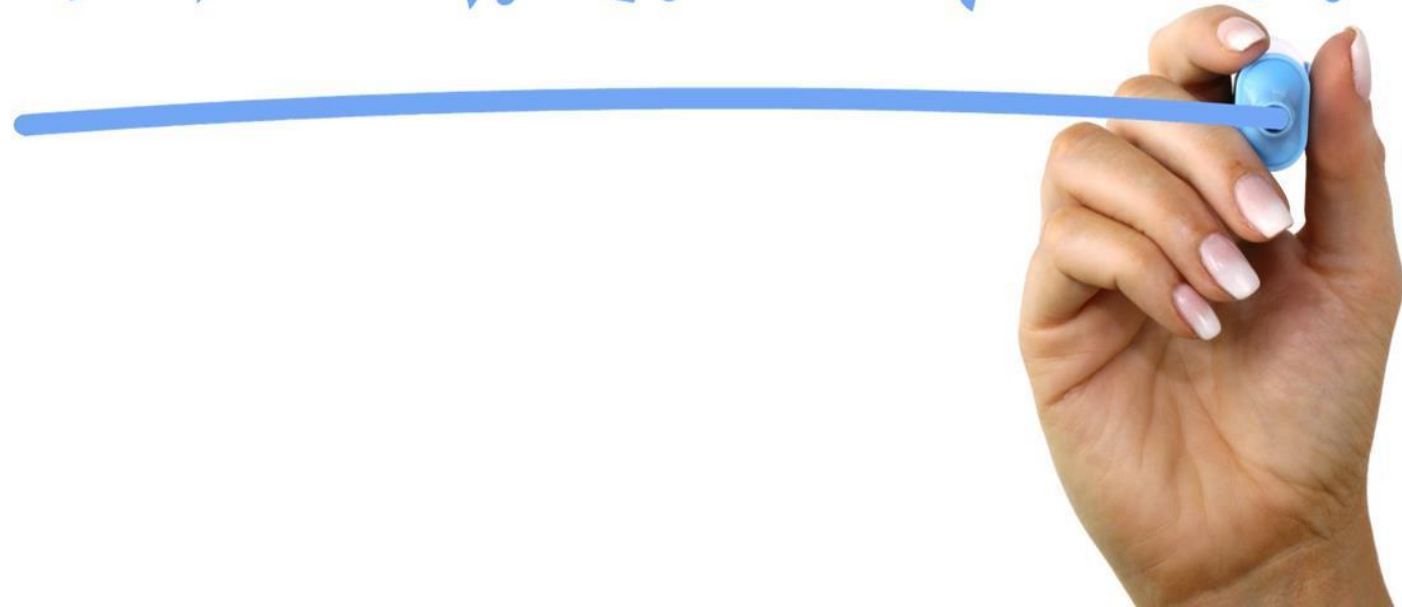





# HAPPY TEACHER'S DAY



Significance of the day - Teacher's Day in India is celebrated on 5th September to commemorate the birth anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. He was a renowned scholar, recipient of Bharat Ratna, first Vice- President, and second President of independent India. He was born on 5 September 1888. As an educationist, he was an advocate of edification and was a distinguished envoy, academician, and above all a great teacher.



Teachers Day is one such event to which students and teachers equally look forward. The Day is important for the students as it gives them a chance to understand the efforts put in by their teachers to ensure that they get a proper education. Similarly, teachers also look forward to the Teachers' Day celebration as their efforts get recognised and honoured by students and other agencies as well.



# Ganesh Chaturthi

During Ganesh Chaturthi devotees bring home idols of Lord Ganesh to worship the deity, eat good food, enjoy with friends and family, and in the end, immerse the idols in water bodies. Also temples offer prayers and distribute sweets such as modaks because it is Lord Ganesh's favourite. The festival marks the birth of Lord Ganesh, the god of wisdom and prosperity. It falls in the Bhadrapada (August-September). Lord Ganesh is considered a symbol of wisdom, writing, travel, commerce and good fortune. He is also called Gajanana, Gajadanta, and Vighnaharta.

The Indian mythology tells the legend of Goddess Parvati creating baby Lord Ganesh using sandalwood paste and asking him to guard the entrance while she took a bath. When Lord Shiva arrived at the entrance and told Ganesh that he wanted to visit Goddess Parvati, Ganesh refused to allow him to pass through. This made Lord Shiva angry and enraged he severed the child's head. When Goddess Parvati realised what had happened, she was heartbroken. Seeing Goddess Parvati overwhelmed with grief, Lord Shiva promised to bring baby Ganesh back to life. He instructed his followers to search for the head of the first living creature they could find. However, they could only find a baby elephant's head. That is how Lord Ganesha came back to life with the head of an elephant.

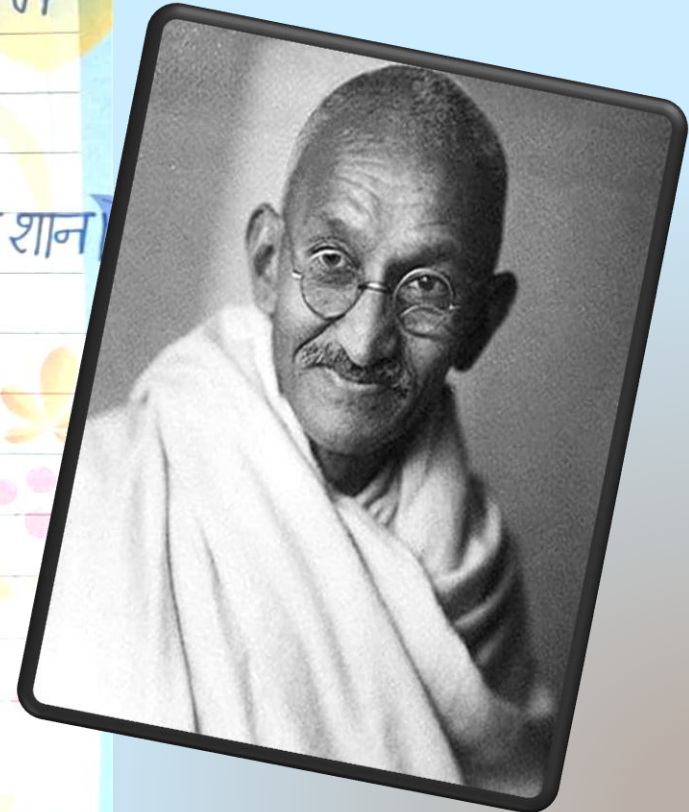

# DUSSEHRA



*Dussehra (Vijaya Dashami, Dasara, or Dashain) is a Hindu festival. Dussehra celebrates the Hindu god Rama's victory over the demon king Ravana and the triumph of good over evil. The epic Ramayana tells the story of the Lord Rama who wins the lovely Sita for his wife, only to have her carried off by Ravana, the demon king of Lanka.*

*Ravana plays an important role in the Ramayana. Ravana had a sister known as Shoorpanakha. She fell in love with the brothers Rama and Lakshmana and wanted to marry one of them.*

*Lakshmana refused to marry her and Rama could not as he was already married to Sita.*

*Shoorpanakha threatened to kill Sita, so that she could marry Rama. This angered Lakshmana who cut off Shoorpanakha's nose and ears. Ravana then kidnapped Sita to avenge his sister's injuries. Rama and Lakshmana later fought a battle to rescue Sita. The monkey god Hanuman and a huge army of monkeys helped them.*

The day is celebrated to raise awareness around the world about IAF as an organization that works towards strengthening national security.
