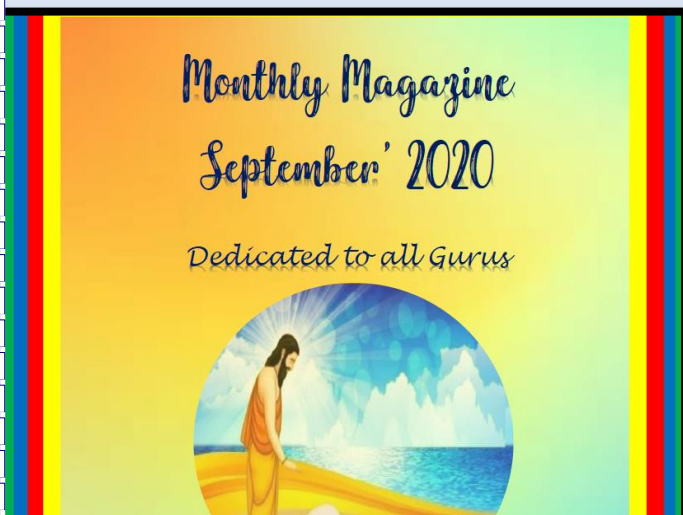
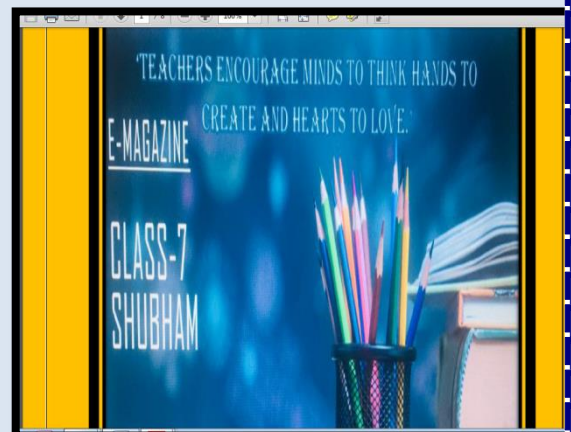
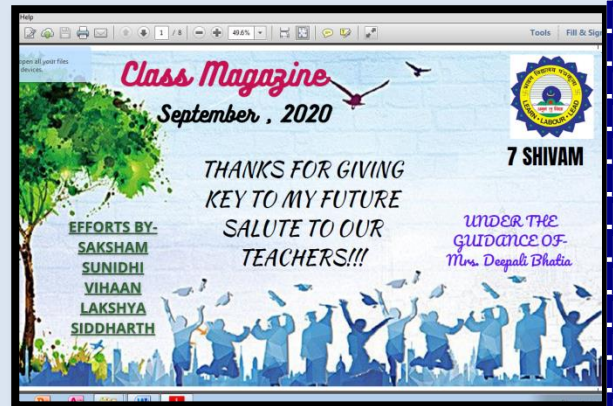

# The end of the tiger?

Some very familiar animals are under threat of extinction. They include the gorilla, African and Asian elephants, the black rhino, the giant panda, and many species of whale, such as the blue, right and fin whale.

Tigers are also in serious danger. A century ago there were more than 100,000 tigers in the wild. Of the eight known subspecies of tiger, three - the Bali, Caspian and Javan are already extinct. There are now fewer than 7,500 tigers left in the wild because their habitats have been destroyed and they have been illegally hunted for their bones and

other parts used in traditional Chinese medicines. Number of the Amur or Siberian, the largest tiger, have fallen to 360-406 in the wild, with fewer than 490 in wildlife parks and zoos. The Sumatran tiger is down to about 400, with 210 in captivity. The Bengal, including the rare white tiger, number 3,159-4,715, with 333 in zoos, and there are only 1,227-1,785 of the Indochinese, with 60 in zoos. Rarest of all is the South China tiger. Its population is down to only 20-30 in the wild and 47 in zoos.

## Lost world

In 2006 a team of 12 scientists returned from an area of rainforest in Indonesia where no humans had ever set foot before. It lies in the Foja mountains on the island of New Guinea and it is so difficult to reach that the explorers had to be dropped in by helicopter. They discovered dozens of new animals and plants, including an orange faced honeyeater, a golden mantled tree kangaroo, 20 new species of frog, 4 new species of butterfly (about 15cm across), and a species of bird that had been considered extinct for over 100 years.

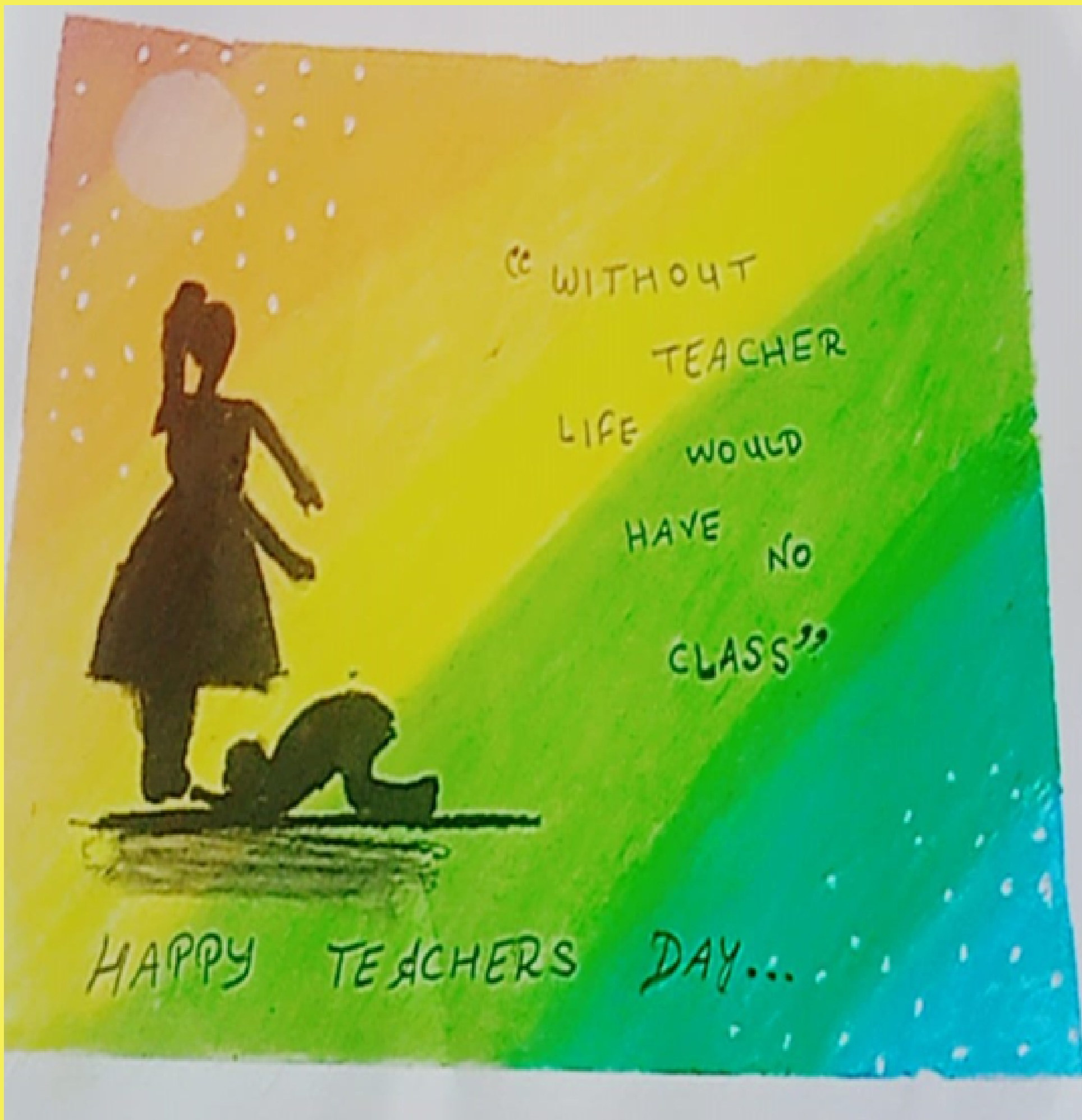

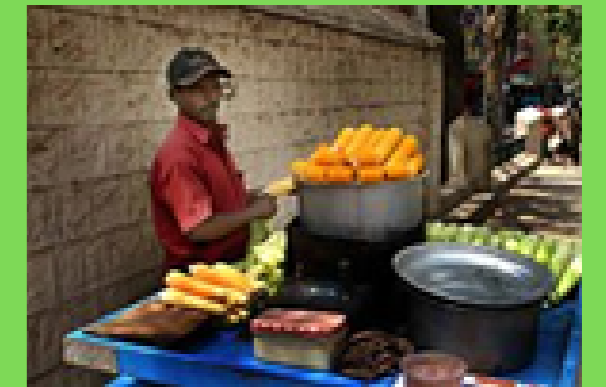

*Road side vending was illegal in urban India until the passage of street vendors act in 2014.*

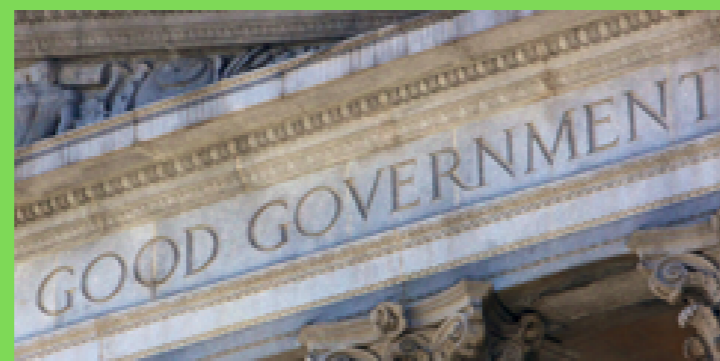
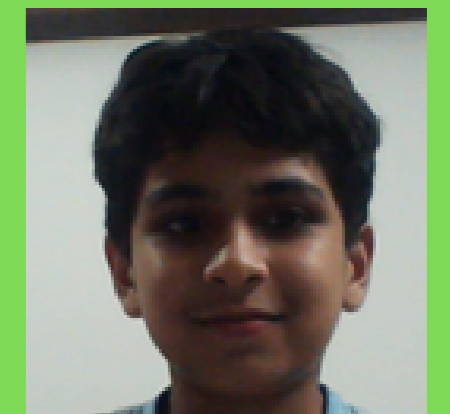


*Despite the law having legalized the activity however, the default policy in most cities across India worsened the Situation. Yet street vending remains employment for many.*

*Of course these street vendors are challenge to business man who pay taxes and rents and are suffering having loss of sales*

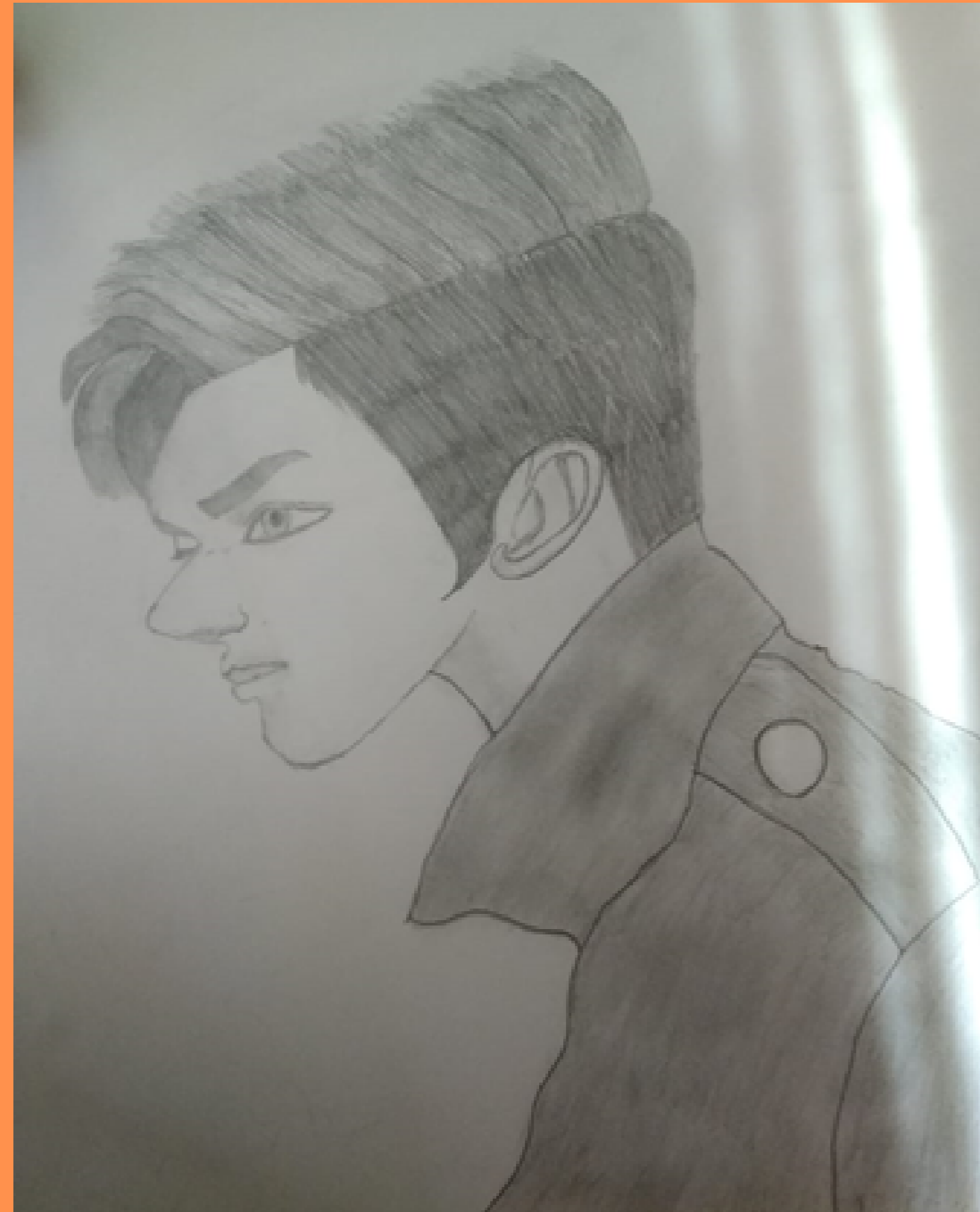

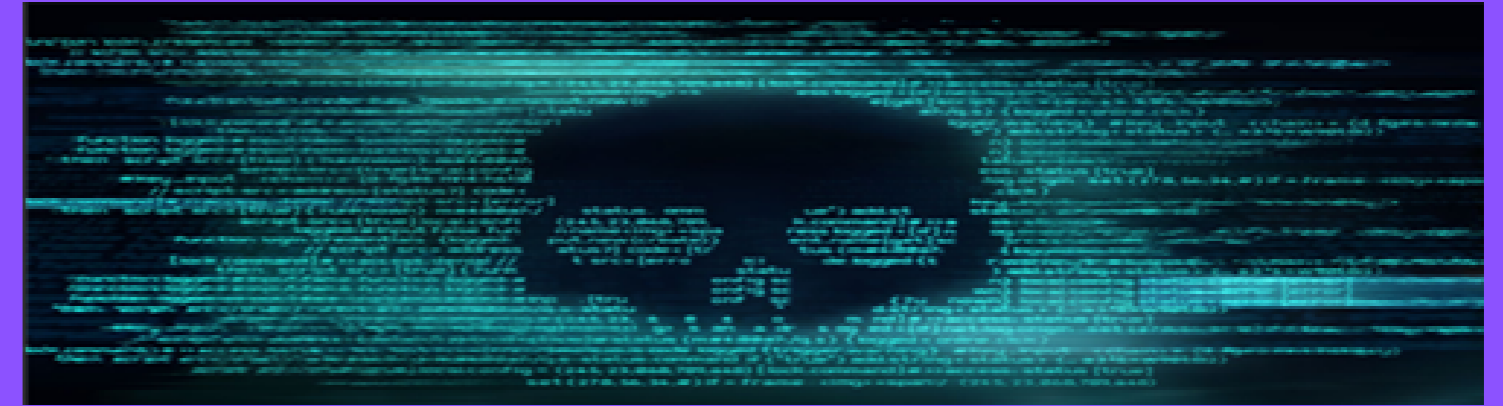

## What is computer virus?

*A computer virus is a type of malicious code or program written to alter the way a computer operates and is designed to spread from one computer to other. a virus operates by inserting or attaching itself to a legitimate program or document that supports macros in order to execute it's code execute it's code.*

## Types of computer virus?

*Boot sector virus :- It infects Master boot record and it is challenging to remove this virus. It requires the system to be formatted. Generally it spreads through removable media.*

*Direct action virus :- Also called non-resident virus it gets installed and stays in the computer memory. It does not affect the system performance.*

*Resident virus:- It gets installed in the system and is very difficult to detect and remove.*

*Multipartite virus:- It can spread through multiple ways. It infects both the boot sector and executable files at the same time.*

*Polymorphic virus:- This is very difficult to detect with a traditional antivirus. This is because it alters it's signature pattern whenever it replicates.*

*Overwrite virus This type of virus deletes all the files it infects. No anti-virus can remove it. The only possible way is to delete all the infected files.*

*Spacefiller virus:- This is also called "cavity virus". This is called so because they fill empty spaces between the codes and hence does not cause any damage to the file.*

# Let's Craft - Flower Vase

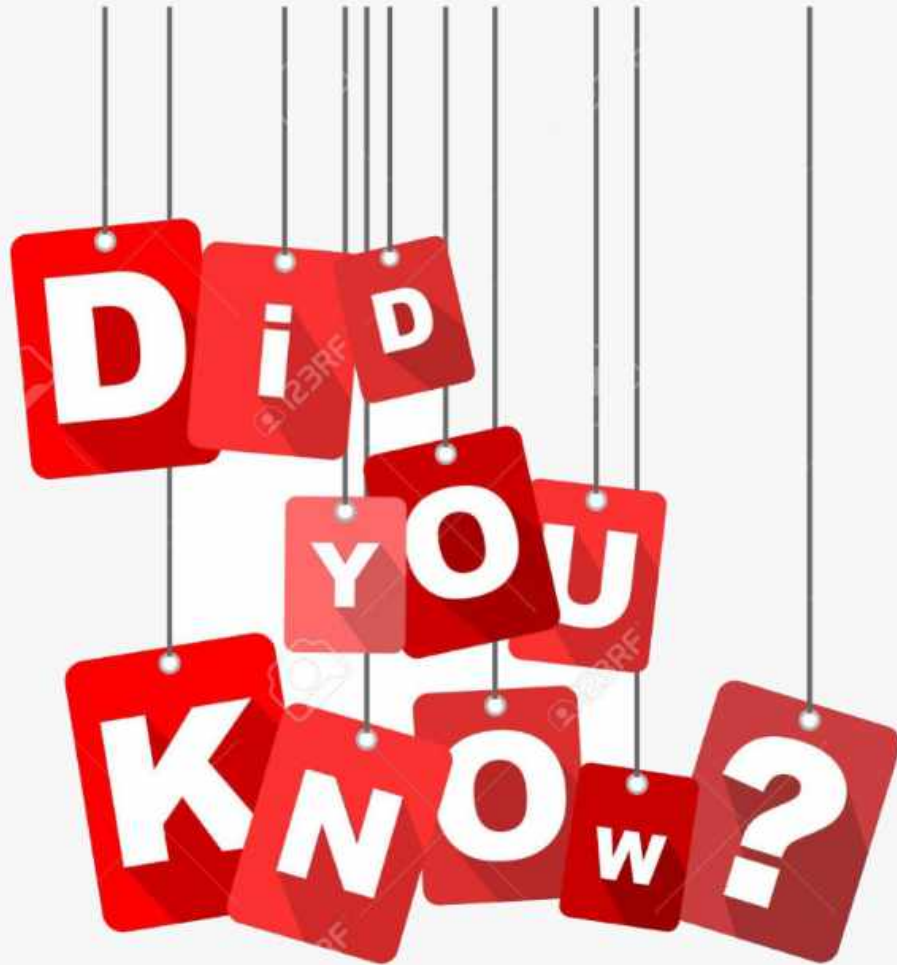

Material Required - Newspaper , Fevicol, Cardboard, Scissors

## Procedure -:

1. Take a newspaper and roll it to make it like a thin, long stick.
2. Make 25 sticks from newspaper.
3. Cut 18 sticks to 14 cm.
4. Join the sticks of 14 cm using fevicol.
5. Cut other 25 sticks more than 15 cm like two sticks to 17 cm , two to 20 cm , other two to 24 cm and the last to 28 cm.
6. Paste the rest of the sticks together from the bigger size to small.
7. Join the sticks together.
8. Take the cardboard and cut a square of 8 cm and paste it on the bottom of the vase

# GET TO WORK IN OUR DIY

## How To Make DIY Mini Notebook

### Things needed -

- ✓ A4 size paper
- ✓ Scissors
- ✓ Stapler
- ✓ Colour Paper
- ✓ Colour Pens
- ✓ Tape
- ✓ Marker

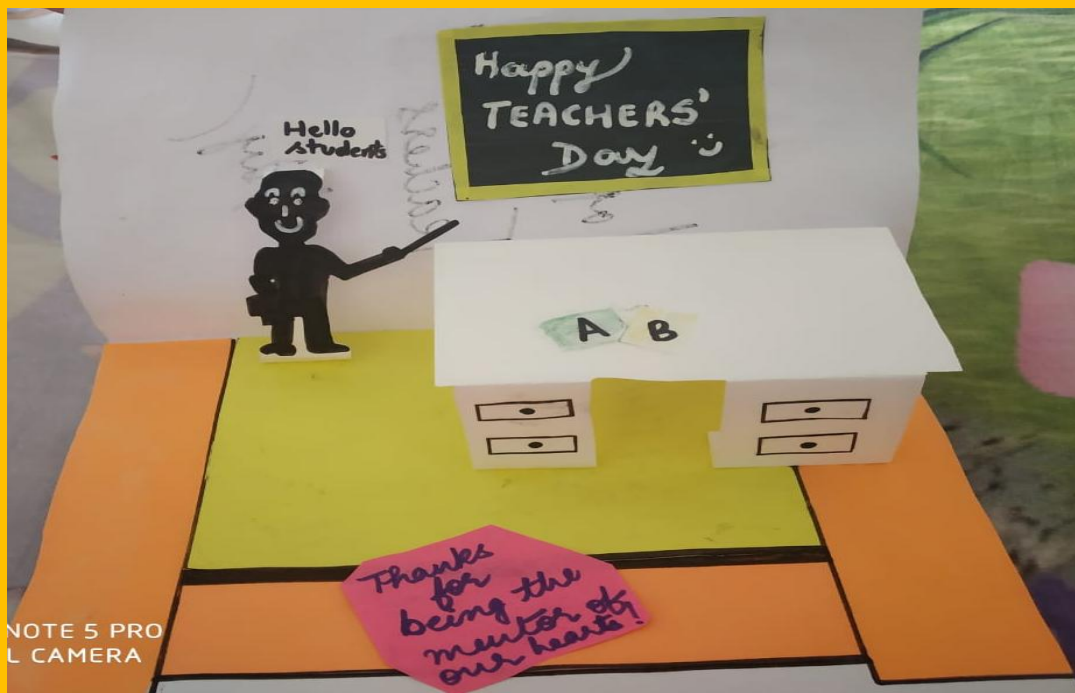


### Steps To Do-

1. *Collect few A4 size sheet and cut then 6cm X 15cm.*
2. *Fold them into half and collect all in order. Staple them together.*
3. *Take a colour paper of your choice and staple it too .*
4. *Now take colour pens and marker and decorate the notebook as you like .Your DIY mini notebook .*



## Teachers day pop up card



Take an A4 size colourful pastel sheet and Fold it into half . Now, take a pastel sheet of length 17.5 cm and breadth 11 cm. Draw vertical lines on-1.5 cm, 5 cm, 6 cm and 5 cm. And then, again draw a vertical line beside it. After that, draw horizontal line between 1.5 cm and 5 cm. Fold the line between 6 and 5 cm from both sides i.e.outwards and inwards and then fold the line between 1.5 and 5 cm inwards. Cut the middle rectangle made using the lines with the gap of 4 cm and fold the rest of the rectangles inwards. Fold the smaller rectangles with the gap of 1.5 cm outwards. Cut four small rectangles using any other paper and trace their borders. Make a dot in between them.

Glue them to the two vertical rectangles in the front to make a table. Now again take the folded pastel sheet and unfold it. Glue one of the sides..Take any other colour and paste it on the glued side. Now fix the table along the wall.

To make the blackboard take a rectangular black sheet. Stick some paper strips of any colour to the border of the sheet. Using a correction pen, write 'Happy Teachers' Day' on it and stick it above the table. Now draw a sketch of a teacher with a stick and colour it with black sketch pen. Stick it beside the board and table. Write a quote on it. Your card is ready.

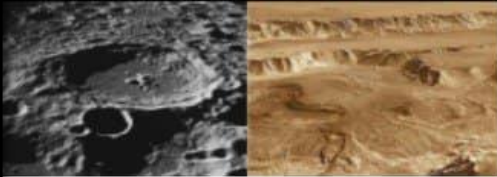

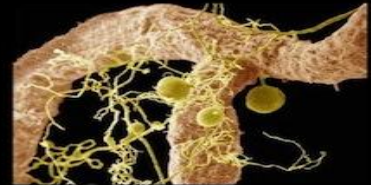

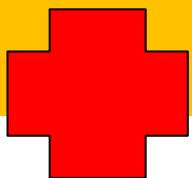

## WORLD FIRST AID DAY

World First Aid Day is observed on the second Saturday of September, every year. The IFRC believes that first aid should be accessible to all including the most vulnerable, and should also be an integral part of a wider developmental approach. First aid day is celebrated to raise public awareness of how first aid can save lives in everyday and crisis situations.

Each year, more than 100 Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies around the world organise events and ceremonies on the second Saturday of September. This day is also celebrated to encouraging first aid training for all and raising awareness about the importance of first aid required in accidents. First aid training provides more than the knowledge and skills to effectively respond it also provides the confidence to act when needed.

### **World First Aid Day history:**

The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) introduced World First Aid Day in 2000. Every year, more than 100 Red Cross and Red Crescent Society people are made aware of the benefits of first aid in the world. On 24 June 1859, Henry Dunant, a young Geneva businessman, witnessed horrifying suffering and agony following the battle of Solferino. He secured them with the necessary materials and supplies and helped in the establishment of temporary hospitals. His book “A Memory of Solferino” inspired the establishment of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in 1863.

### **Importance of First Aid:**

Millions of people are hurt or killed from injuries every year because adequate and timely assistance is not provided. Effectively, first aid reduces deaths, injuries, and impact during disasters and daily emergencies. Its primary goal is to protect life and keep the condition from worsening. Every time it is not necessary that some medical staff help. In an emergency, even ordinary people can help and can save someone's life by providing first aid. It provides an immediate response to an emergency, taking life-saving measures until professional help arrives. Simple first aid skills, and the confidence to use them, can save lives and everyone, if properly trained, has the potential to save lives.

### **World First Aid Day: Objective**

First aid knowledge and skills must be made available to ALL. More and more people and volunteers should have the capacity to provide quality first aid community-based services. Simple first aid skills, and the confidence to use them, can save lives and everyone, if properly trained, has the potential to save lives.

**Follow these steps to keep cuts clean and prevent infections and scars.**

1. Wash your hands. First, wash up with soap and **water** so you don't get bacteria into the cut and cause an infection.
2. Stop the bleeding. Put pressure on the cut with a gauze pad or clean cloth.
3. Clean the wound.
4. Remove any dirt or debris.

# *Struggle in Life*

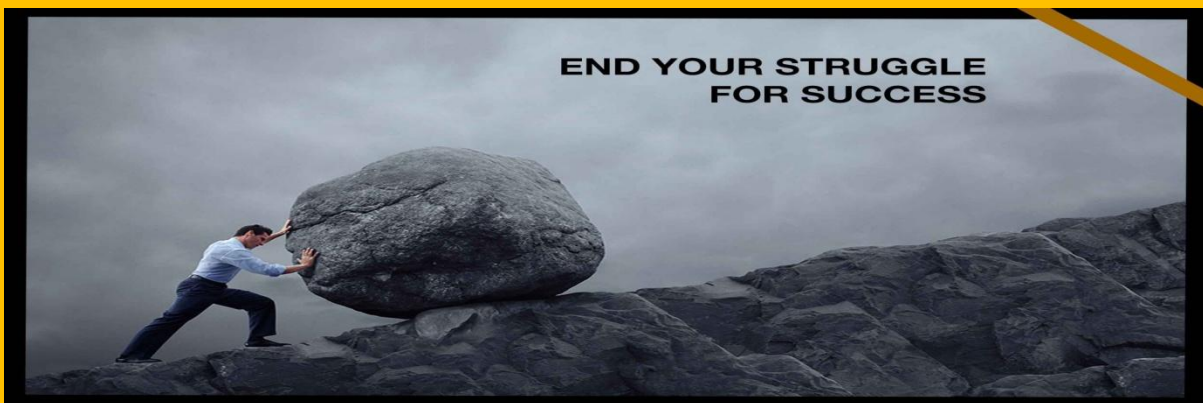
*“We are not there, to play, to dream, to drift,

## INCREASING POLLUTION

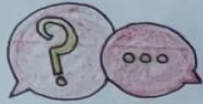

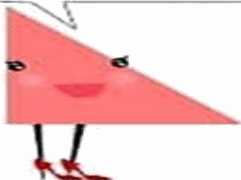

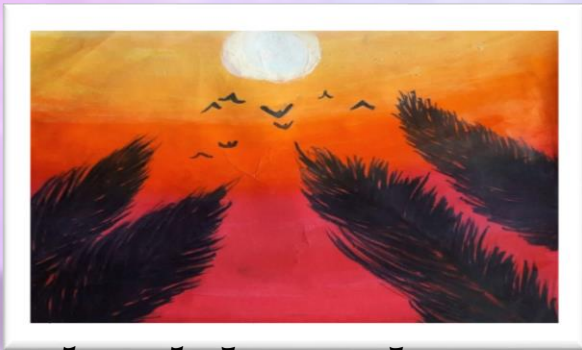
