Charlie and the Chocolate Factory

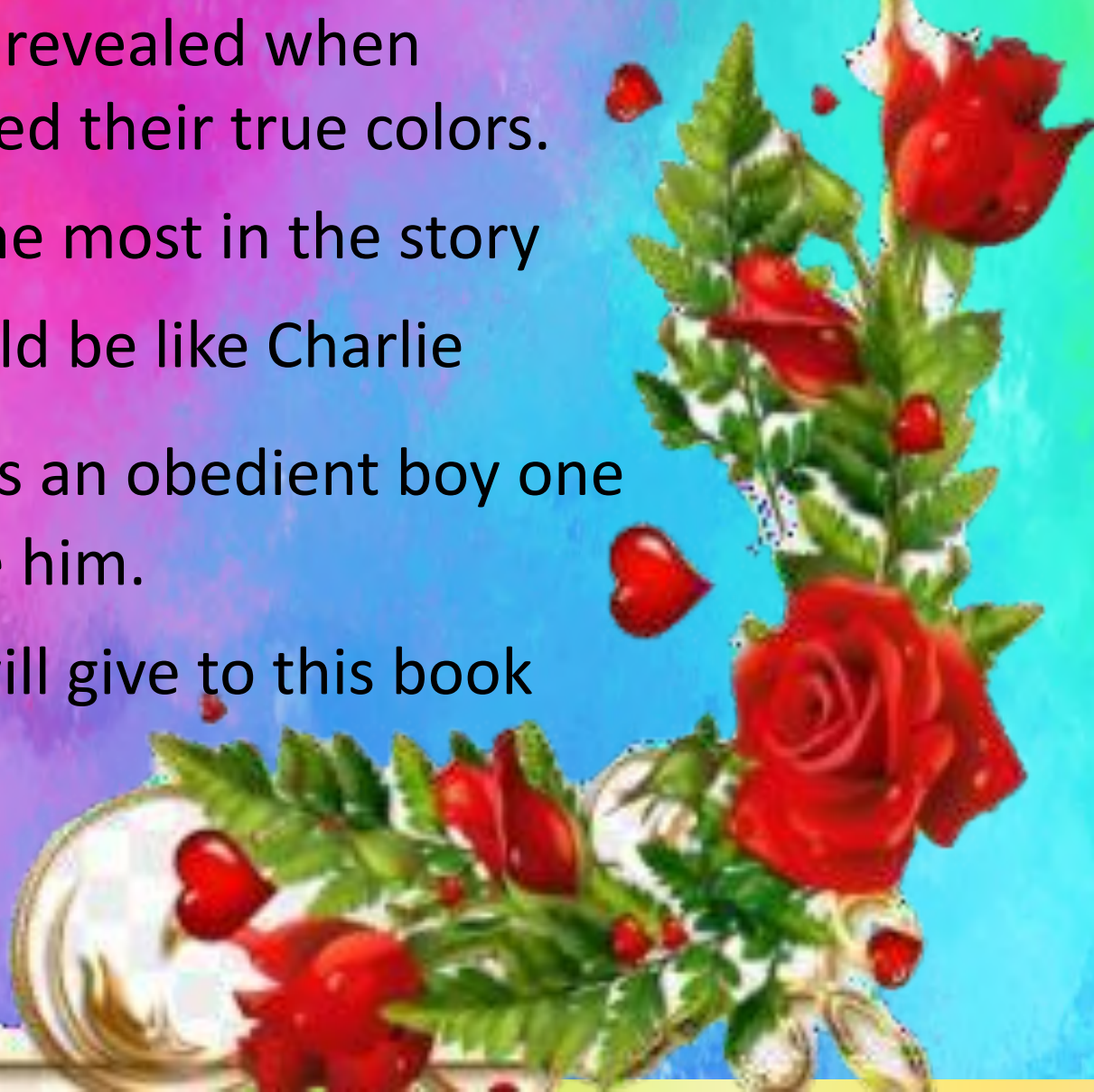
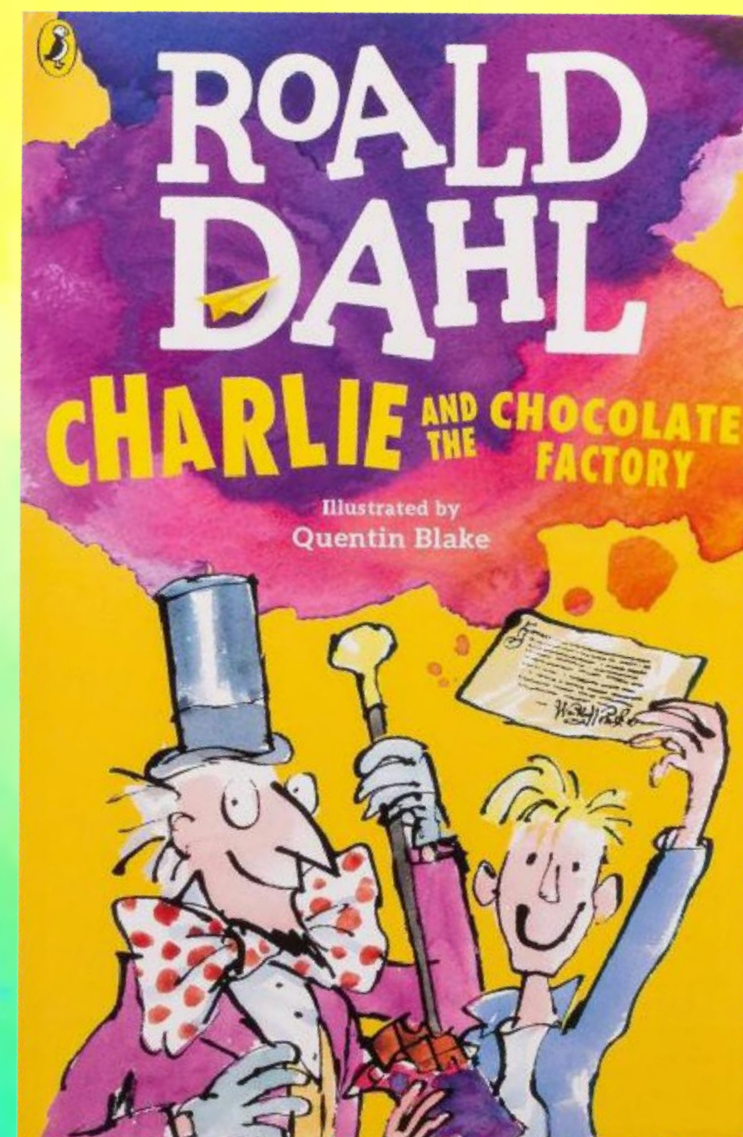

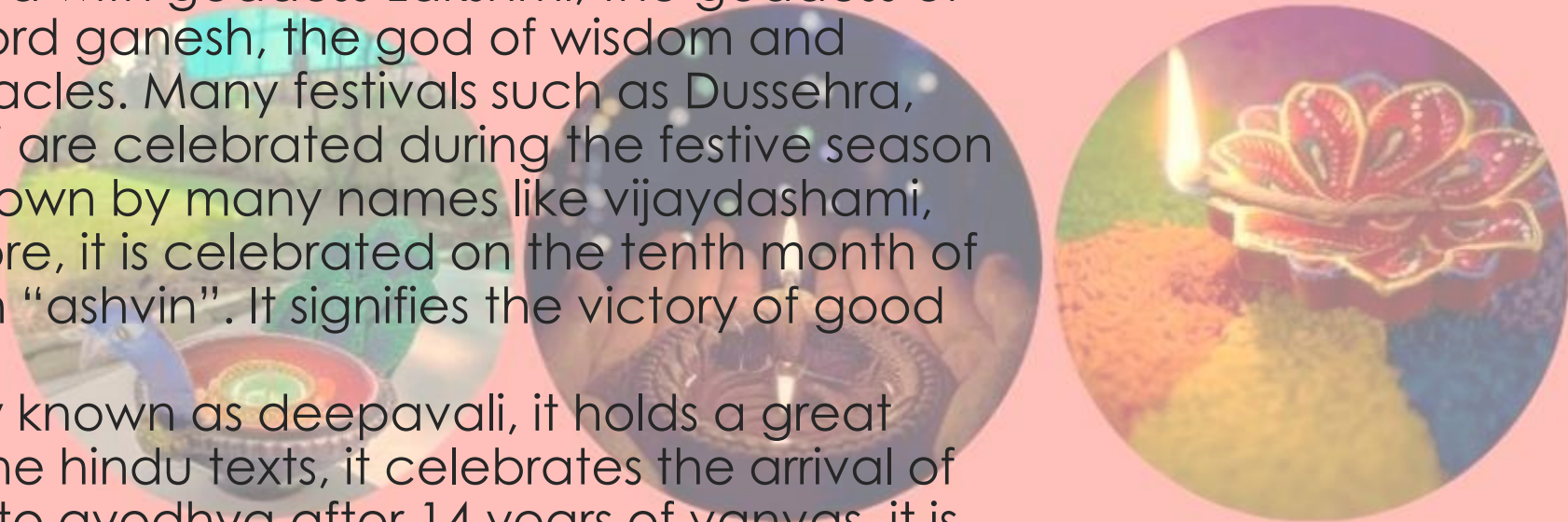
FESTIVE SEASON:

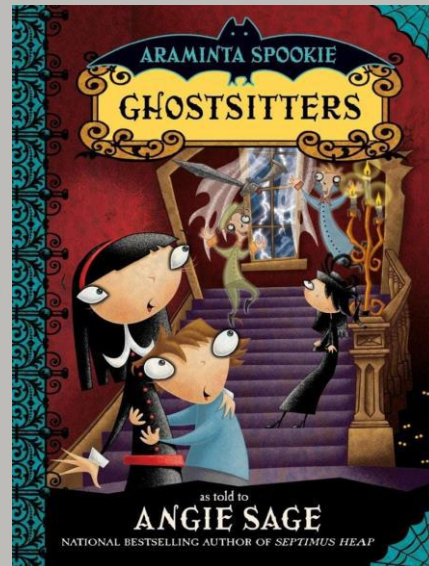

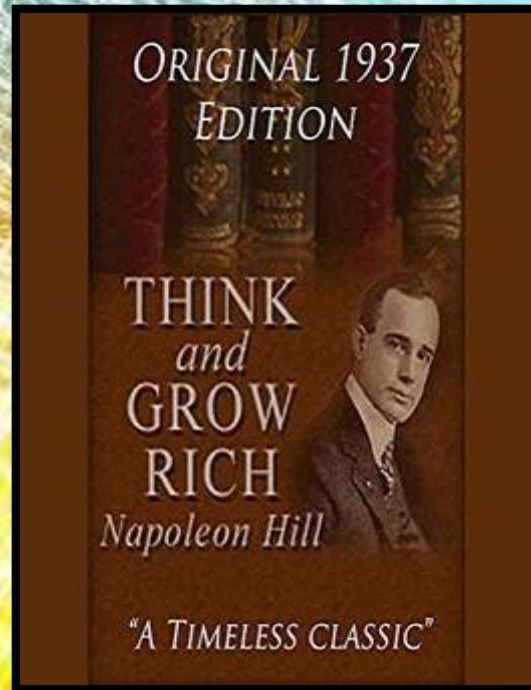

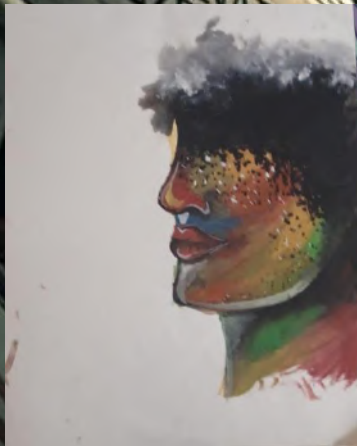

... 'VENICE OF THE NORTH'

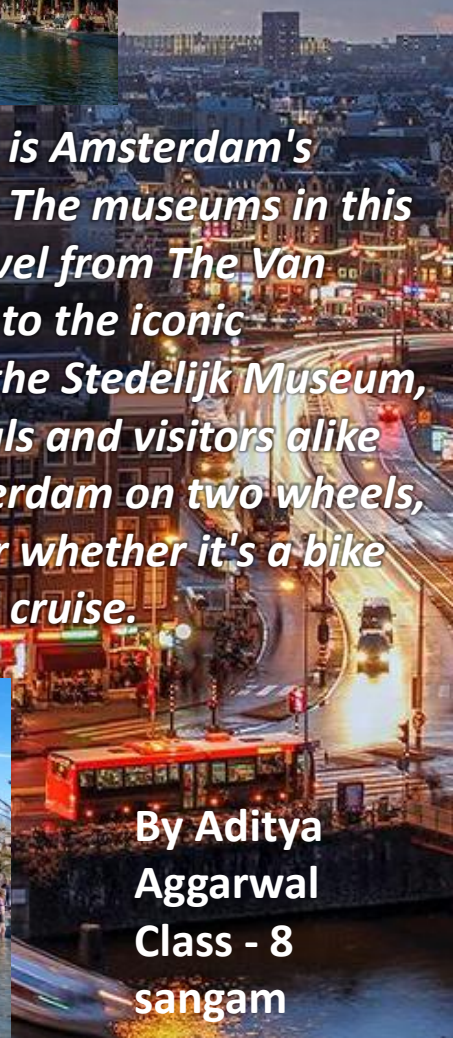

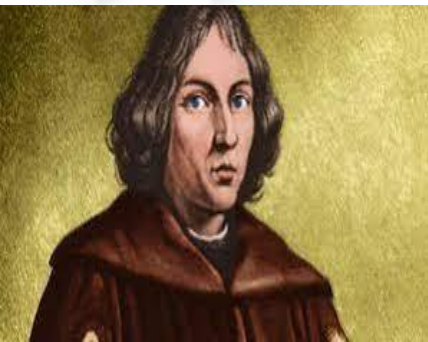
